**SOUTH 90<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE RIGHT OF WAY VACATION AND ORDINANCE VACATION A PORTION OF 90<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE IMMEDIATELY NORTH OF 125<sup>TH</sup> STREET (OLIVERA – 8920 WEST 125<sup>TH</sup> STREET AND GLOODT – 12500 SOUTH 90<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE):** Indalecio and Patricia Olivera filed an application requesting the Village vacate both halves of the South 90<sup>th</sup> Avenue unimproved right-of-way that is adjacent to the West property line of property commonly known as 8920 W. 125<sup>th</sup> Street in Palos Park, IL. Two property owners adjacent to the ROW vacation were notified of the application. The owners of 12416 S. 90<sup>th</sup> Avenue objected to the vacation of the right-of-way adjacent to their property. The owner of 12500 S. 90<sup>th</sup> Avenue supports the vacation and is interested in purchasing the portion of the ROW adjacent to his lot. Plan Commission held a public hearing regarding the application on Thursday, April 18, 2018 and voted (7-0) to recommend approval of the requested right-of-way vacation of 90<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

Commissioner Pavlatos moved, seconded by Commissioner Milovich-Walters, to approve the request of Indalecio and Patricia Olivera for the Village to vacate both halves of the South 90<sup>th</sup> Avenue right of way that is adjacent to the West property line of 8920 W. 125<sup>th</sup> Street in Palos Park, IL and adopt an ordinance vacating a portion of 90<sup>th</sup> Avenue, immediately North of 125<sup>th</sup> Street, (Olivera - 8920 West 125<sup>th</sup> Street, and Gloodt - 12500 South 90<sup>th</sup> Avenue).

**HENDERSON RESUBDIVISION – 44 OLD CREEK ROAD:** The owner of 44 Old Creek Road has requested approval of a preliminary and final plat for a two (2) lot subdivision. The subject site is 2.16 acres containing an existing home in the R-1-A One Family Dwelling District that will remain on a 1.15 acre lot and a new 1.01 acre lot created to the west. Plan Commission held a public hearing relative to said request on June 20, 2018 and recommended approval of said resubdivision.

Commissioner Polk moved, seconded by Commissioner Pavlatos, to approve a preliminary and final plat for a two (2) lot subdivision for property commonly known as 44 Old Creek Road and adopt an ordinance approving the Henderson Resubdivision.

R.M. POST SUBDIVISION – 8220 W. 119<sup>TH</sup> STREET: The owner of 8220 W. 119<sup>th</sup> Street has requested approval of a preliminary and final plat for a three (3) lot subdivision. The subject site is 3.076 acres containing an existing home in the R-1-A One Family Dwelling District that will remain on a 1.07 acre lot and two new 1.00 acre lots will be created to the east. Plan Commission held a public hearing relative to said request on June 20, 2018 and recommended approval of said subdivision subject to the condition that no building permit shall be issued in relation to Lot 2 of said subdivision until such time as the existing improvements and structures as identified for demolition and removal on the Preliminary Demolition Plan, prepared by Landmark Engineering, LLC and dated May 21, 2018 and attached as Exhibit A and made part hereof are demolished and removed from the property within the subdivision.

Commissioner Pavlatos moved, seconded by Commissioner Polk, to approve a preliminary and final plat for a three (3) lot subdivision for property commonly known as 8220 W. 119<sup>th</sup> Street and adopt an Ordinance approving the R.M. Post Subdivision subject to the condition set forth in Section 2 of said ordinance.

**COMMISSIONER OF BUILDING & PUBLIC PROPERTY, G. DARRYL REED:**

**BUILDING DEPARTMENT REPORT:** In Commissioner Reed's absence, Mayor Mahoney reported the Building Department issued fifteen (15) permits from June 20, 2018 – July 3, 2018 resulting in \$5,664.82 in fees. Twenty-six (26) inspections were completed during this time, no occupancy permits issued and no exaction fees collected.

**COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY, DANIEL POLK**

**POLICE ACTIVITY REPORT:** Commissioner Polk reported the Police Department received 1,975 calls for service from June 18, 2018 through July 9, 2018. Palos Park Police also issued 74 adjudication tickets, 34 traffic tickets, 61 written warnings, 66 verbal warnings, completed 33 case reports, arrested 13 adults, 1 juvenile, 8 impounds, 20 senior checks, 55 citizen assists and 20 community contact hours.

**PALOS PARK WOMAN'S CLUB DONATES \$500.00:** The Palos Park Woman's Club presented the Palos Park Police Department with a check for \$500.00. It is through their continued support that the Palos Park Police have been able to secure equipment and training and support of the Police Cadet Program. On behalf of the Village and the Palos Park Police, Commissioner Polk extended his heartfelt appreciation to the Palos Park Woman's Club.

**BIKE HELMETS:** The Palos Park Police Department is distributing bike helmets to children as part of the National Children-N-Safety Program. Head injuries and falls from bicycles are often times the main reason children visit emergency rooms during the summer months. Helmets can be picked up at the Police Department, 8999 W. 123<sup>rd</sup> Street between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday – Friday.

**COMMISSIONER OF ACCOUNTS AND FINANCES, JAMES PAVLATOS:** Commissioner Pavlatos had no formal report this evening.

**MAYOR'S REPORT:** Mayor Mahoney had no formal report this evening.

**MANAGER'S REPORT:**

**RENEWAL OF THE AGGREGATION PROGRAM FOR ELECTRICAL LOAD:**

Manager Boehm reported the Village's current agreement with Dynegy Energy expires on meter reading dates in October, 2018. The Village has again engaged NIMEC, who managed the initial aggregation in September 2012. NIMEC has solicited bids from multiple suppliers and consulted with the Village on their decision to select the supplier that best meets their needs. Four bids were received. The Village Council finds it to be in the best interests of the Village and residents to accept the bid from MC Squared and to enter into a Master Supply Agreement with MC Squared for a period of twelve (12) months. The Aggregation Program shall continue to operate as an opt-out program for residential and small commercial retail customers. NIMEC is not compensated by the Village; instead NIMEC acts as a broker and is compensated by the winning supplier.

Commissioner Polk moved, seconded by Milovich-Walters, to adopt an Ordinance Authorizing the Renewal of the Aggregation Program for Electrical Load.

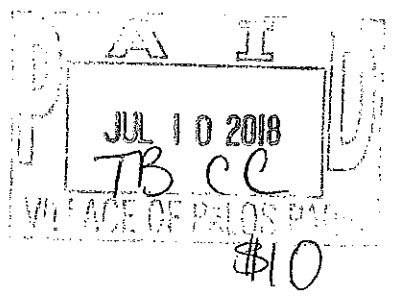

**RAFFLE MANAGER BOND WAIVER REQUEST**

All operation of and the conduct of raffles shall be under the supervision of a single raffle manager designated by the organization. The manager shall give a fidelity bond in an amount determined by the licensing authority in favor of the organization conditioned upon his/her honesty in the performance of his/her duties. Terms of the bond shall provide that notice shall be given in writing to the licensing authority not less than thirty (30) days prior to its cancellation. The Village Council may waive this bond requirement by including a waiver provision in the license issued to an organization, provided that a license containing such waiver provision shall be granted only by unanimous vote of the members of the licensed organization.

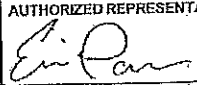

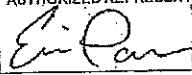

### **AGENDA MATTER:**

Renewal of Health, Dental and Life Insurance

### **BACKGROUND/HISTORY:**

The Village of Palos Park's health benefit plans renews on August 1st each year. Open enrollment will occur following employee informational presentations.

As with the past, the Village utilized the services of the Horton Group (broker) to assist us with insurance, risk management, and employee benefits for full time employees of the Village. There are 28 employees participating in the program with their dependents (does not include working spouses who have other health insurance available).

Through the Horton Group, the Village was quoted the medical component of the benefit plan by four carriers including our current provider. The current provider, United Health Care (UHC) did quote several plan alternatives to the current Village Plan, dramatically changing some of the deductibles and out of pocket costs. The renewal UHC plan is quoted at 15% over the current plan cost; the quote was originally 23.5% higher until Horton negotiated the rate.

Blue Cross Blue Shield (BCBS) has quoted very competitive pricing. Using a very similar plan design to our current medical plans, BCBS's quote increases the premium cost by 4.7%. This plan differs from our current plan in that there are six (6) tiers of prescription copays as opposed to the three (3) currently, and they have a preferred pharmacy list (CVS is not on this list). BCBS offered an alternative medical plan tied with its BCBS Dental Plan, this plan alternative would increase the medical by .51% while increasing the dental by 26.29% (and increasing the annual benefit maximum from \$1,000 to \$1,500). The net effect of pairing the BCBS medical and dental proposals is a 2.1% overall increase when compared to the current year plans. The Village' FY19 budget anticipates an approximate 21.08% health/dental insurance increase.

The core life/accidental death and dismemberment insurance policy with Principal at no increase. Employees are offered optional (employee expense) additional life insurance beyond the \$50,000 policy the Village purchases, that insurance is available through Principal. Employees will also continue to be offered voluntary participation in a vision program through VSP.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends the healthcare and dental coverage be combined under the Blue Cross Blue Shield program, remain with Principal for life/AD&D coverage, Principal for voluntary life, and VSP for the voluntary vision program.

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:**

I move to approve the following for the Village's August 1, 2018 employee health care program: Blue Cross Blue Shield for the medical and dental portions of the program, Principal for core life and AD&D coverage, Principal for voluntary life, and VSP for voluntary vision.

**AGENDA MATTER:**

Emergency Sanitary Force Main Repair

**BACKGROUND/HISTORY:**

In late July Public Works staff noticed water ponding at the Northwest corner of 123<sup>rd</sup> Street and 93<sup>rd</sup> Avenue. Initially we investigated for a water main leak. The water main was not leaking but PW found the force main under 123<sup>rd</sup> Street was leaking water when the pumps turned on and the pressure in the pipe increased. After thoroughly cleaning the 4" diameter pipe, PW televised the force main. A hole was found under the newly paved west bound lane of 123<sup>rd</sup> Street. The force main was too small to complete a spot repair internally. Rather than dig up the newly paved street to repair one location, PW sought a proposal from Airy's Inc. to line the entire force main to eliminate future problems. Airy's submitted a proposal to complete the work at a lump sum cost of \$ 33,843.00. On July 31, 2018 the lining was installed. While the work was being done Airy's was responsible for bypass pumping any sewage that entered the 93<sup>rd</sup> Avenue Lift Station. On August 1, 2018, it was found that the liner had collapsed under the street. Airy's then had to directionally drill a new 4" force main under the street adjacent to the existing pipe and replace any of the existing force main where the liner had failed. On August 3, 2018 Airy's completed the drill, and replaced any pipe with a defective liner at no additional cost to the Village. By the end of day the lift station was back on and functioning.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends approving the proposal submitted by Air's for the repair of the force main under 123<sup>rd</sup> Street from the 93<sup>rd</sup> Avenue Lift Station.

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:**

I move to waive the bidding process and approve the proposal from Airy's in the amount of \$ 33,843.00 to complete an emergency repair on the 4" force main from the 93<sup>rd</sup> Avenue Lift Station.

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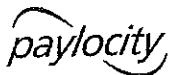

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**AGENDA MATTER:**

An Ordinance approving the Zoning Board of Appeals Case: ZBA 2018-3 – Consideration of an application requesting variations from the requirements of Chapter 1268.02 (e) Front Yards and Chapter 1268.02 (F) Side Yards of the Village Code to permit the construction of a front porch, a first floor garage addition, and second floor addition to an existing non-conforming single family residence. Where the required front yard setback is 33.69 feet, the applicant is requesting a front yard setback of 24.75 feet for the front porch and 32.75 feet for the garage addition. Where the required side yard setback is 15 feet, the applicant is requesting a 9.06 foot setback from the side lot line at the property commonly known as 7934 W. 121<sup>st</sup> Street in Palos Park, IL.

**BACKGROUND/HISTORY:**

The subject property, is zoned R-1-A Single Family Residential and is developed with an existing single-family home. The applicant proposes to construct a 397 square foot second floor addition on the existing 1,900 square foot single story dwelling that will include a 76 square foot (5'7" x 11'7") garage addition and a new 158 square foot (8' x 20'8") covered front porch. The proposed setbacks for the garage and front porch additions are 32'9" and 24'9", respectively. The total area of all the new additions is 700 square feet, or 36.8% of the existing dwelling.

The property is nonconforming with respect to lot size due to the lot containing only 10,625 square feet and 85 feet of lot width at the front lot line. Variances must be granted to construct the building as proposed as the existing front setback is 30.42 feet where the required setback is 33.69 feet (the average of the block), and the existing side setback is 9.06 feet where 15 feet is required.

The proposed 24'9" front porch setback, or 8.94 foot variation, is 26.53% of the requirement and within the maximum limit of 33%. The proposed 32'9" garage setback, or 0.94" variation, is 2.79% of the requirement and within the maximum limit of 60%. Finally, the proposed 9.06' side setback, or 5.94' variation, is 39.6% of the requirement and within the maximum limit of 60%.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

The staff has reviewed the application and recommends *approval* of the .94 and 8.94 foot front setback variances, and the 5.94 foot side setback variance requested to construct an addition on the property commonly known as 7934 W. 121<sup>st</sup> Street.

**ZONING BOARD RECOMMENDATION:**

The Zoning Board of Appeals met on Wednesday, July 11, 2018 to consider the variance requests. Several neighbors attended the meeting, all speaking in support of the request. Finding that the proposed improvement was consistent with the character of the surrounding area, and noting that the small size of the lot created an undue burden under the strict application of the code, voted (4-0) to recommend *approval* of the requested .94 and 8.94 foot front setback variances, and the 5.94 foot side setback as required by Chapter 1268.02 (e) and (f) of the Village of Palos Park Code.

**RECOMMENDED MOTIONS:**

I move to approve the Ordinance for the requested .94 and 8.94 foot front setback variances, and the 5.94 foot side setback as required by Chapter 1268.02 (e) and (f) of the Village of Palos Park Code rear yard variance of 14.5 feet from the required 50 feet from Chapter 1268.02(g) of the Village Code.

[Decreasing the required side yard setback, for the East side

yard only, to 9.06 feet.]

**SECTION 4:** That an 8.94 foot variation (26.53%) from the 33.69 foot minimum front yard setback requirement of Section 1268.02(e) of the Palos Park Village Code is granted to the owner(s) of the above-described property, but only in regard to the new 158 square foot covered front porch to be constructed on the above-described property. [Decreasing the required front yard setback, for the new 158 square foot covered front porch only, to 24.75 feet.]

**SECTION 5:** That a 0.94 foot variation (2.79%) from the 33.69 foot minimum front yard setback requirement of Section 1268.02(e) of the Palos Park Village Code is granted to the owner(s) of the above-described property, but only in regard to the new 76 square foot garage addition to be constructed on the above-described property. [Decreasing the required front yard setback, for the new 76 square foot garage addition only, to 32.75 feet.]

**III. PUBLIC HEARING:**

**ZBA 2018 - 03:**

An application has been filed by Anna Budz requesting variations from the requirements of Chapter 1268.02 (e) Front Yards and Chapter 1268.02 (F) Side Yards of the Village Code to permit the construction of a front porch, a first floor garage addition, and second floor addition to an existing non-conforming single family residence. Where the required front yard setback is 33.69 feet, the applicant is requesting a front yard setback of 24.75 feet for the front porch and 32.75 feet for the garage addition. Where the required side yard setback is 15 feet, the applicant is requesting a 9.06 foot setback from the side lot line at the property commonly known as 7934 W. 121<sup>st</sup> Street in Palos Park, IL.

Interim-Chair Martin introduced the public hearing and then turned it over to Lauren Pruss who presented the staff report and then reiterated the existing setbacks on the home are non-conforming and by increasing the bulk of the building with the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor addition is reason for the variance request. Lauren also added the significant change of topography of at least ten feet across the street would mitigate approval of this home addition.

Anna Budz, the petitioner, introduced herself and stated the ongoing problem with the house is the rain and snow, which makes the flat roof collapse and leak. She wants to make her house better and visually appealing in the neighborhood. Anna confirmed there is not a lot of living and only has a crawl space so there is a need for more room. She prefers to have a steep roof so that she is not dropped by her insurance company again for making too many claims. Anna lived here for three years and wants to improve her home.

Lauren Pruss added that Anna Budz modified the original architectural plans to make it more conforming. There was a proposed dormer on the east side but after working with Village staff, Anna made changes to scale back the variance request.

Magda Oktoba, 7912 W. 121<sup>st</sup> Street, addressed all and said that she lives next door and she changed the roof line on her house to be pitched. She said her street is the ugliest in Palos Park and thinks that allowing these changes will truly appreciate the properties. She reiterated that there are only one car garages and no basements with the houses on this block. Magda said that Anna's addition will enhance Palos Park, increase property values and not have any negative impact.

Interim-Chair Martin stated that is the Zoning Board's job to allow variances to fit within the Code and the hardship criteria. He continued saying this is a typical case and they definitely take impact into consideration.

Ruta Grigas, 7942 W. 121<sup>st</sup> Street, is a 30 year resident of Palos Park who added a peaked roof and an addition to her home. She also wanted to expand her garage because of the limited space she has but has decided she will be listing her house for sale soon. She supports Anna's request for the variances and likes the diversity of Palos Park; small homes and palatial homes.

Member Marsh asked Lauren for clarification regarding a statement about the side setback not changing at all. Lauren answered that when you put the pitched roof on the 2<sup>nd</sup> story addition, the addition/living space meets the setbacks but the roof puts it over the setback limitation.

Paul Sabella, 7915 W. 120<sup>th</sup> Street, wanted to attend the meeting to see how the process works regarding variance requests because he will probably apply for the same. He would like to add to his garage in the front and add a front porch.

Member Marsh commented that this is not the first time a front yard setback has been presented to the Zoning Board. He said the calculation of the average of the setback gives more leeway to homeowners. Member Marsh gave the example of when many houses on a street block are all in line and then one home is setback much further on the property, throws the average off being setback so far. The average setback requirement makes the homes have an appropriate street view.

Member Marsh made a motion to recommend the Village Council approve the requested .94 and 8.94 foot front setback variances and the 5.94 foot side setback as required by Chapter 1268.02(e) and (f) of the Village of Palos Park Code to allow the construction of an addition on the property commonly known as 7934 W. 121<sup>st</sup> Street.

Interim-Chair Martin reminded the petitioner that the ZBA is a recommending body and the Village Council will vote on it at the next meeting on August 13, 2018.

**ANALYSIS**

**DESCRIPTION**

The subject property, commonly known as 7934 w. 121<sup>st</sup> Street, is zoned R-1-A Single Family Residential and is developed with an existing single-family home. The applicant proposes to construct a 397 square foot second floor addition on the existing 1,900 square foot single story dwelling that will include a 76 square foot (5'7" x 11'7") garage addition and a new 158 square foot (8' x 20'8") covered front porch. The proposed setbacks for the garage and front porch additions are 32'9" and 24'9", respectively. The total area of all the new additions is 700 square feet, or 36.8% of the existing dwelling.

The property is nonconforming with respect to lot size due to the lot containing only 10,625 square feet and 85 feet of lot width at the front lot line. Additionally, variances must be granted to construct the building as proposed as the existing front setback is 30.42 feet where the required setback is 33.69 feet (the average of the block), and the existing side setback is 9.06 feet where 15 feet is required.

In accordance with Section 1264.04 Variances, there is a limitation on the amount of a variation a petitioner can request. Chapter 1264.04 (e) states: "To permit a front....yard less than that required by this Zoning Code, but such variance shall not exceed thirty-three percent of the depth of the front yard...." Further, Chapter 1264.04 (s) states: "Provided the parcel in question is a single-family residential parcel of less than one acre in size, and the requested variance relates to either the construction of an addition to the existing building that does not increase the square footage of the existing building by more than fifty percent (50%) .... of the square footage of the existing building, to permit a side or rear yard of less than that required by this Zoning Code, but such variance shall not exceed sixty percent (60%) of the depth of the rear yard or the width of the side yard, as required by this Zoning Code.

The proposed 24'9" front porch setback, or 8.94 foot variation, is 25.5% of the requirement and within the maximum limit of 33%. The proposed 32'9" garage setback, or 0.94" variation, is 2.7% of the requirement and within the maximum limit of 60%. Finally, the proposed 9.06' side setback, or 5.94' variation, is 39.6% of the requirement and within the maximum limit of 60%.

**ANALYSIS OF STANDARDS – VARIATIONS**

Section 1264.07 of the Village Code states that the Zoning Board of Appeals shall utilize the following standards for reviewing and developing Findings of Fact recommendations regarding Variation requests:

1. **Site Conditions:** There are one or more unusual physical conditions of the site, such as

size, shape, or slope, that were not created by a person having an interest in the property, that are unavoidable or uncorrectable, or that are worthy of preservation, such as a creek, wetland, or specimen trees, and that make it a substantial burden to use the property or develop the property, or otherwise result in a substantial loss of value or cause the site to be unable to yield a reasonable return, without a variance.

**Finding.** The block was originally platted in 1893 as 50 foot wide lots of record. A subsequent parcel division created three 85 foot wide lots on the block that were developed prior to annexation to the Village in 1972. All of the lots on this block are smaller than the one acre minimum required by the code and most do not meet the minimum required lot width. Additionally, the existing front and side setbacks are not in conformance with today's requirements. These conditions have existed prior to the establishment of today's standard and are unavoidable by the current owner of the property. As a result, any proposed modification to the building that alters its footprint, or increases its height would require a variance to be granted.

- 2. Development Design:** The variation would not merely serve the temporary social or personal convenience of an occupant, and an alternative development plan that would conform to Code would not be suitable for the uses permitted by Code and would not be typical of similar properties in the area.

**Finding.** Due to the existing setbacks of the building, any proposed modification to the building that alters its footprint, or increases its height would require a variance to be granted.

- 3. Community Impact:** The variation would retain the essential character, scale, intensity, and open space of the area, and would be in harmony with the purposes of the Zoning Code as stated in Section 1260.02 of this Code, and would not be substantially injurious to other property, or be detrimental to public interests or adopted Village plans.

**Finding.** The applicant has stated that the proposed addition would be in keeping with the essential character of the surrounding area as there exists a variety of home styles and heights. On 121<sup>st</sup> Street, all of the homes are single story dwellings on lots of less than one acre in size. While a second story addition is not consistent with the pattern of development, it should be noted that a topographical change results in an increase of 5-10 feet directly across the street, raising those buildings higher than those on the south side of the street. Additionally, any second story or pitched roof addition would require a variance due to the existing non-conforming setbacks of the dwelling.

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

The staff has reviewed the application and recommends *approval* of the .94 and 8.94 foot front setback variances, and the 5.94 foot side setback variance requested to construct an addition on the property commonly known as 7934 W. 121<sup>st</sup> Street.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

I move to recommend that the Village Council approve the requested .94 and 8.94 foot front setback variances, and the 5.94 foot side setback as required by Chapter 1268.02 (e) and (f) of the Village of Palos Park Code to allow the construction of an addition on the property commonly known as 7934 W. 121<sup>st</sup> Street.

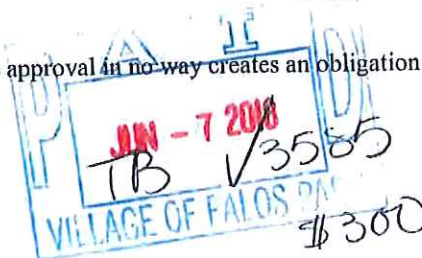

## VARIANCE HARDSHIP CRITERIA

The following criteria (Village Code Section 1264.07) are used by the Village to help determine if property conditions are hardships that are sufficient to grant a zoning variance.

### A. Site Conditions

1. What are the unusual physical conditions of the site; such as size, shape, slope, or other natural or manmade features; that make it a substantial burden to use the property or develop the property?

**The site is adequate but the building is not. It has a flat roof with standing water after it rains and a heavy load of snow during snow falls which may lead to a dangerous collapse of the roof. Due to the building's tiny rooms and lack of a basement, there is lack of storage space and crowded living conditions. The building completely lacks esthetical value.**

- a. Were these conditions created by current owners of the property? **No.**
- b. Are these conditions unavoidable or uncorrectable?  
**Yes. Without expanding the size of inhabitable space, changing the roof line, and adding eye-pleasing architectural features, these conditions are unavoidable and uncorrectable.**
- c. Are these conditions worthy of preservation?  
**No, they are burdensome and detrimental not only to esthetics of the neighborhood but also the property value.**
- d. Is the loss of value or reasonable return due to these conditions substantial?  
**Yes. The flat roof with rain water/snow accumulation causing occasional leaks in the house, a very small living area along with lack of storage, and unsightly appearance of the house will keep the property value low for years to come and uncomfortable living conditions.**

### B. Development Design

1. Would the variation serve only the temporary social or personal convenience of the occupant?  
**No, the variation would be permanent.**
2. Is there another way to design the development that would be suitable for the permitted uses and that does not require a variance?  
**No. The variance seems to encompass everything in the new design that was created to enhance living conditions, the curb appeal of the house and enhance esthetics of the neighborhood.**

- A. Is this other design similar to other development in the neighborhood?

### C. Community Impact

3. Would the proposed development with the variance alter the essential character, scale, intensity, and open space patterns in the area?

**No, it would not. Palos Park has a medley of architectural styles anywhere from tiny farm houses to multimillion dollar mansions that are located in close proximity. In my immediate area, there is a small low building at 12039 S 80<sup>th</sup> Ave ("B" on map) next to a large, high bi-level house located on at 12035 80<sup>th</sup> Ave ("C" on map). There is a small, low ranch house at 7920 Palos Ave ("D" on map) on the other side of the high bi-level building. The most drastic difference in house heights, styles and sizes is evident on 120<sup>th</sup> street of our neighborhood. Two ranch houses at 7919 and 7915 W 120<sup>th</sup> street ("E" and "F" on map) are located next to two houses at 7909 and 7905 W 120<sup>th</sup> street ("G" and "H" on map) with high pitch roofs enclosing partial attic and living area according to Cook County Assessor's property description (enclosed). A huge, two-story house at 7914 W 120<sup>th</sup> street ("J" on map) is located directly across the street from two small and low ranch buildings ("E" and "F" on map). Another high pitch roof, 1.5 -1.9 story house with partial attic and living area is located at the end of the street, 7900 W 120<sup>th</sup> street ("I" on map). The six houses on 120<sup>th</sup> street in Palos Park provide a drastic contrast of building sizes, heights, and styles that were allowed to be constructed along one, short street. My house's proposed development with the variance would bring depth and definition to its flat façade and roof, turning it from unsightly barrack into eye-pleasing building. The development with the variance will be in line with the houses in the neighborhood and further enhance its character, appeal, and value.**

**Yes.**

1. Would the proposed development with the variance be substantially injurious to other property?  
**No.**

- a. Would it be detrimental to public interests?

**No. I hope that part of the Village Plan is beautification of Palos Park and happy residents.**

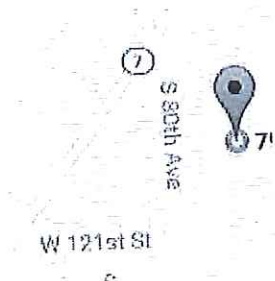

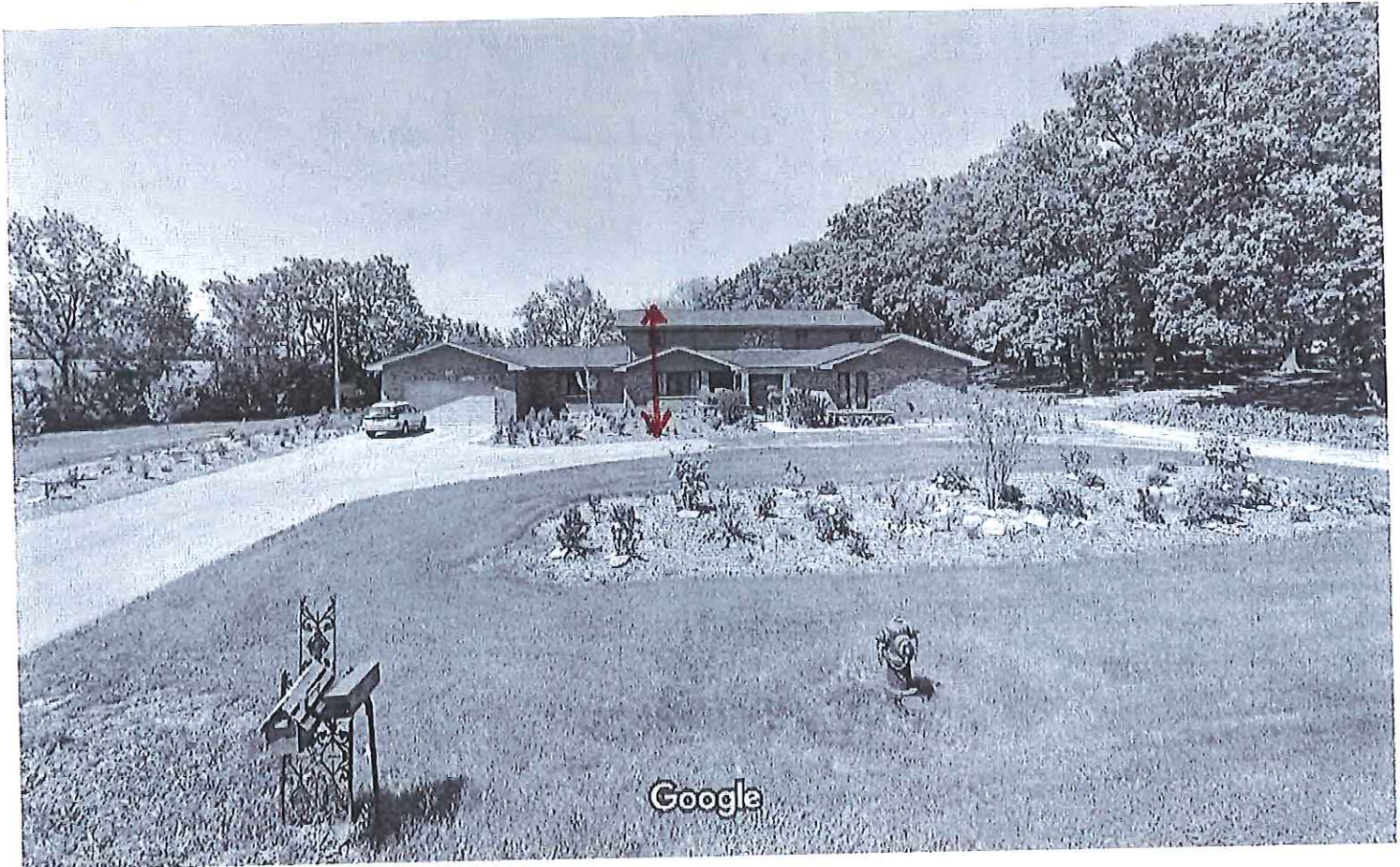

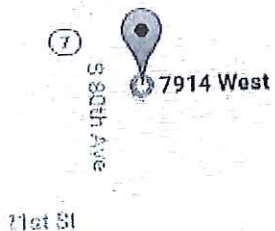

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**AGENDA MATTER:**

Text amendments to the Palos Park Zoning Ordinance to make changes regarding the placement of small wireless facilities in conformance with the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act (P.A. 100-585). The Village of Palos Park is requesting Text Amendments which include, but may not be limited to: a Text Amendment to Chapter 1260.08 Definitions to define Small Wireless Facilities; Chapter 1278.02 to add Small Wireless Facilities as a permitted Special Use; Text Amendments to Chapters 1268.02, 1270, 1272, 1274.02, and 1274.03 to permit Small Wireless Facilities as a permitted use when located entirely within a public right-of-way in the R-1-A, R-4, B-1 and B-2 Zoning Districts; and Text Amendments to Chapter 1275.02 and 1276.02 to allow Small Wireless Facilities as a permitted use anywhere within the O-1 and M-1 Zoning Districts.

**BACKGROUND/HISTORY:**

SB 1451 created the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act (the “Act”), and was signed into law on April 12, 2018, as Public Act 100-0585. The Act has the primary goal of allowing the telecommunications industry to roll out a 5G telecommunications network in the next several years with minimal input by local governments regarding the placement of small cell installations. In order to create an effective 5G network, the industry has indicated small cell antennas must be placed in populated areas approximately every 200-300 feet, typically on utility or other poles in the right-of-way.

The Act specifies how municipalities may regulate the collocation of small cell antenna installations (known under the Act as “small wireless facilities”). Among other things, the Act will allow small cell antenna installations to be placed on municipal utility poles (light poles, traffic signals, etc.) of a telecommunication provider’s choosing subject to compliance with certain basic standards regarding safety and aesthetics, regardless of whether the municipality agrees to such placement. Such placements are exempted under the Act from any zoning review and are deemed to be permitted uses both in all right-of-ways (regardless of zoning district) and outside of right-of-ways in areas zoned exclusively for commercial or industrial use. Annual fees payable to municipalities for installations on municipal utility poles are capped at \$200/year. There are strict permit processing and approval timelines in the Act, and providers are able to submit multiple location requests in a single application. Other topics covered in the Act include application requirements and fees, pole attachment agreement requirements, installation of new poles by telecommunication providers, the interplay between small cell antenna installations and

municipal public safety technology, height limitations, design standards, undergrounding, timelines for approval, and application fees. The Act exempts the City of Chicago, preempts home rule, and includes a 3-year sunset date. While the Act has an effective date of June 1, 2018, the substantive provisions of the Bill have an implementation date of August 1, 2018.

In order to ensure compliance with the Act, the Village Attorney developed the attached zoning amendment (Attachment 1) to regulate small cell installations, consistent with the requirements of the Act. An additional amendment to Chapter 10 of the Municipal Code is also required (Attachment 2). Finally, the Village will also adopt the attached draft design guidelines to ensure that these facilities are installed in the most aesthetic manner possible (Attachment 3). It should be noted that due to the relative lack of existing street lights and other utility poles within the public right-of-way throughout most of the Village, it is anticipated that the majority of any 5G equipment installed in the Village would be located on new utility poles erected specifically for the installation of the 5G equipment.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends *approval* of the proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance to regulate Small Wireless Facilities.

**PLAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION:**

The Plan Commission met on Thursday, July 19, 2018 to consider the proposed zoning amendment and design guidelines. Finding that the proposed amendments were necessary to provide the Village with the greatest amount of control over small wireless facilities, the Commission voted (5-0) to recommend *approval* of the requested zoning text amendment to the Village of Palos Park Code. The Commission further recommended that the proposed design guidelines encourage colocation of small wireless facilities, and require that new utility poles installed for these facilities be constructed of materials consistent with other utility poles in the surrounding area.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2018 – 24**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING VARIOUS SECTIONS OF THE VILLAGE OF PALOS PARK ZONING ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Village Council of the Village of Palos Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION 1:**

A. That a petition proposing certain amendments to the text of the Village of Palos Park Zoning Ordinance (“Zoning Ordinance”) relative to small wireless facilities (the “Proposed Text Amendments”) was filed by the Village of Palos Park (“Petitioner”); and

B. That on July 19, 2018, the Plan Commission held a public hearing on the Proposed Text Amendments pursuant to notice thereof given in the manner required by law, and, after considering all of the testimony and evidence presented at the public hearing, recommended approval of the Proposed Text Amendments by a vote of five (5) in favor and zero (0) opposed; and

C. That the Village Council of the Village of Palos Park approves and adopts the recommendation of the Plan Commission and, pursuant to the authority granted under Division 13 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-13-1 et seq.), approves the Proposed Text Amendments to the Zoning Ordinance set forth below, and finds the adoption of the Proposed Text Amendments to be in the best interests of the Village.

**SECTION 2:** Section 1268.02 (R-1-A One-Family Dwelling District) of Chapter 1268 (R-1-A District) of Title Six (Zoning), in the Palos Park Zoning Ordinance, is hereby amended by adding the following text to subsection (a) (Permitted Uses):

(6) Small Wireless Facilities, as defined and regulated in Chapter 1032, when located entirely within a public right-of-way

**SECTION 3:** Chapter 1270 (R-4 Planned Unit Development District) of Title Six (Zoning), in the Palos Park Zoning Ordinance, is hereby amended by adding a new Section 1270.12 (Small Wireless Facilities), to read in its entirety as follows:

**1270.12 SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES.** In addition to other uses permitted within the R-4 Planned Unit Development District, Small Wireless Facilities, as defined and regulated in Chapter 1032, shall be a permitted use within an R-4 Planned Unit Development District when located entirely within a public right-of-way, and shall be classified as a Minor Change under Section 1270.07.

**SECTION 4:** Section 1274.02 (B-1 Limited Retail Business District) of Chapter 1274 (Business Districts) of Title Six (Zoning), in the Palos Park Zoning Ordinance, is hereby amended by adding the following text to subsection (a) (Permitted Uses):

Small Wireless Facilities, as defined and regulated in Chapter 1032, when located entirely within a public right-of-way

**SECTION 5:** Section 1274.03 (B-2 General Retail and Wholesale Business District) of Chapter 1274 (Business Districts) of Title Six (Zoning), in the Palos Park Zoning Ordinance, is hereby amended by adding the following text to subsection (a) (Permitted Uses) at its proper alphabetical location:

Small Wireless Facilities, as defined and regulated in Chapter 1032, when located entirely within a public right-of-way

**SECTION 6:** Section 1275.02 (Use Regulations) of Chapter 1275 (O Office District) of Title Six (Zoning), in the Palos Park Zoning Ordinance, is hereby amended by adding the following text to subsection (a) (Uses Permitted) at its proper alphabetical location:

Small Wireless Facilities, as defined and regulated in Chapter 1032.

**SECTION 7:** Section 1276.02 (M-1 Limited Manufacturing District) of Chapter 1276 (Manufacturing Districts) of Title Six (Zoning), in the Palos Park Zoning Ordinance, is hereby amended by adding the following text to subsection (a) (Permitted Uses) at its proper alphabetical location:

Small Wireless Facilities, as defined and regulated in Chapter 1032;

**SECTION 8:** Section 1278.02 (Permitted Uses; Council Authority) of Chapter 1278 (Special Uses) of Title Six (Zoning), in the Palos Park Zoning Ordinance, is hereby amended by amending subsection (v) (Radio and Television Transmitting or Antenna Towers (Commercial), Antenna Towers Used for the Sending of Private Messages (Including Cellular Telephone Antenna Towers), and Other Electronic Equipment Requiring Outdoor Structures Related Thereto, But Not Including Private Receive-One Radio and Television Aerials or Antennas) to read in its entirety as follows:

(v) **Radio and Television Transmitting or Antenna Towers (Commercial), Antenna Towers Used for the Sending of Private Messages (Including Cellular Telephone Antenna Towers), and Other Electronic Equipment Requiring Outdoor Structures Related Thereto, But Not Including Private Receive-Only Radio, and Television Aerials or Antennas and Small Wireless Facilities.** Permitted in any B or M District, and on any government owned property, with a Public Lands (PL) designation on the Village's Zoning Map, located in any R-1-A District;

**SECTION 9:** Section 1278.02 (Permitted Uses; Council Authority) of Chapter 1278 (Special Uses) of Title Six (Zoning), in the Palos Park Zoning Ordinance, is hereby further amended by adding a new subsection (z) (Small Wireless Facilities), to read in its entirety as follows, and by renumbering existing subsections (z) and (aa) as (aa) and (bb):

Small Wireless Facilities. As defined and regulated in Chapter 1032, are permitted in any use district except where such facilities are permitted uses (within the right-of-way in any zoning district, and outside of the right-of-way in the O and M-1 Districts);

**SECTION 10:** All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, to the extent of such conflict, are repealed.

**SECTION 11:** Each section, paragraph, clause and provision of this Ordinance is separable and if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance, nor any part thereof, other than that part affected by such decision.

**SECTION 12:** Except as to the Text Amendments set forth above in this Ordinance, all Chapters and Sections of the Village of Palos Park Zoning Ordinance, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 13:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PALOS PARK VILLAGE CODE RELATIVE TO THE PERMITTING, REGULATION AND DEPLOYMENT OF SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Palos Park (“Village”) is a municipal corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois; and

**WHEREAS**, the public rights-of-way within Village limits are used to provide essential public services to Village residents and businesses. The public rights-of-way within the Village are a limited public resource held by the Village for the benefit of its citizens and the Village has a custodial duty to ensure that the public rights-of-way are used, repaired and maintained in a manner that best serves the public interest; and

**WHEREAS**, growing demand for personal wireless telecommunications services has resulted in increasing requests nationwide and locally from the wireless industry to place small cell antenna facilities, distributed antenna systems, and other small wireless telecommunication facilities on utility and street light poles and other structures both within the public rights-of-way and in other locations; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village is authorized under the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 *et seq.*, and Illinois law to adopt ordinances pertaining to the public health, safety and welfare; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village is further authorized to adopt the amendments contained herein pursuant to its authority to regulate the public right-of-way under Article 11, Division 80 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-80-1 *et seq.*); and

**WHEREAS**, the Village is authorized, under existing State and federal law, to enact appropriate regulations and restrictions relative to small cell antenna facilities, distributed antenna systems, and other small personal wireless telecommunication facility installations both within the public rights-of-way and in other locations within the jurisdiction of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, Public Act 100-585, known as the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act, approved by the Governor on April 12, 2018, with an effective date of June 1, 2018, acts to impose certain additional requirements on municipalities, including the Village, regarding the permitting, construction, deployment, regulation, operation, maintenance, repair and removal of certain defined small wireless facilities both within public rights-of-way and in other locations within the jurisdiction of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, in conformance with the requirements of the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act, and in anticipation of a continued increased demand for placement of

small wireless facilities of the type regulated by the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act both within the public rights-of-way and in other locations within the jurisdiction of the Village, the Mayor and Village Council finds that it is in the best interests of the public health, safety and general welfare of the Village to adopt the code amendments below in order to establish generally applicable standards consistent with the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act (Public Act 100-585) for the design, permitting, location, construction, deployment, regulation, operation, maintenance, repair and removal of such small wireless facilities both within the public rights-of-way and in certain other locations within the jurisdiction of the Village so as to, among other things: (i) prevent interference with the facilities and operations of the Village utilities and of other utilities lawfully located in public rights-of-way or in other locations within the Village; (ii) preserve the character of the neighborhoods in which such small wireless facilities are installed; (iii) minimize any adverse visual impact of small wireless facilities and prevent visual blight in the neighborhoods in which such facilities are installed; (iv) ensure the continued safe use and enjoyment of private properties adjacent to small wireless facilities; (v) provide appropriate aesthetic protections to designated areas and historic landmarks or districts within the Village; and (vi) ensure that the placement of small wireless facilities does not negatively impact public safety and the Village's public safety technology.

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF PALOS PARK, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS:**

**SECTION 1:** The recitals above shall be and are incorporated in this Section 1 as if fully restated herein.

**SECTION 2:** Title Two (Street Areas) of the Palos Park Village Code is amended by adding a new Chapter 1032 (Small Wireless Facilities), to read in its entirety as follows:

**1032.01 PURPOSE.** Consistent with the requirements of the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act (Public Act 100-585), and in anticipation of a continued increased demand for placement of small wireless facilities of the type regulated by the Act both within the public rights-of-way and in other locations within the jurisdiction of the Village, the Village Council has found it to be in the best interests of the public health, safety and general welfare of the Village to adopt the code amendments set forth in this chapter in order to establish generally applicable standards for the design, permitting, location, construction, deployment, regulation, operation, maintenance, repair and removal of such small wireless facilities both within the public rights-of-way and in other locations within the jurisdiction of the Village so as to, among other things:

- A. Prevent interference with the facilities and operations of the Village's utilities and of other utilities lawfully located both within public rights-of-way and in other locations within the jurisdiction of the Village;
- B. Preserve the character of the neighborhoods in which such small wireless facilities are installed;
- C. Minimize any adverse visual impact of small wireless facilities and prevent visual blight in the neighborhoods in which such facilities are installed;
- D. Ensure the continued safe use and enjoyment of private properties adjacent to small wireless facilities;
- E. Provide appropriate aesthetic protections to any designated historic landmarks or districts within the Village; and
- F. Ensure that the placement of small wireless facilities does not negatively impact public safety and the Village's public safety technology.

**1032.02 INTERACTION WITH OTHER CODE PROVISIONS AND LAWS.**

A. Other Code Provisions. The provisions of this chapter are intended to supplement general requirements and standards relative to the siting of telecommunication facilities and generally applicable requirements for construction within public rights-of-way set forth elsewhere within this code, including but not limited to the regulations set forth in chapter 1030 (Construction of Utility Facilities in the Rights-of-Way). In the event of a conflict, however, the provisions of this chapter shall control in all matters involving small wireless facilities, as defined below.

B. State and Federal Laws. In the event that applicable federal or State laws or regulations conflict with the requirements of this chapter, a wireless provider shall comply with the requirements of this chapter to the maximum extent possible without violating such federal or State laws or regulations.

### **1032.03 DEFINITIONS.**

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

"Act" means the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act (Public Act 100-585).

"Antenna" means communications equipment that transmits or receives electromagnetic radio frequency signals used in the provision of wireless services.

"Applicable codes" means uniform building, fire, electrical, plumbing, or mechanical codes adopted by a recognized national code organization or local amendments to those codes, including the National Electric Safety Code.

"Applicant" means any person who submits an application and is a wireless provider.

"Application" means a request submitted by an applicant to the Village for a permit to collocate small wireless facilities, and a request that includes the installation of a new utility pole for such collocation, as well as any applicable fee for the review of such application.

"Authority" means the Village or other unit of local government that has jurisdiction and control for use of public rights-of-way as provided by the Illinois Highway Code for placements within public rights-of-way or has zoning or land use control for placements not within public rights-of-way.

"Collocate" or "collocation" means to install, mount, maintain, modify, operate, or replace wireless facilities on or adjacent to a wireless support structure or utility pole, whether existing or new.

"Communications service" means cable service, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 522(6), as amended; information service, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 153(24), as amended; telecommunications service, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 153(53), as amended; mobile service, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 153(33), as amended; or wireless service other than mobile service.

"Communications service provider" means a cable operator, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 522(5), as amended; a provider of information service, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 153(24), as amended; a telecommunications carrier, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 153(51), as amended; or a wireless provider.

"FCC" means the Federal Communications Commission of the United States.

"Fee" means a one-time charge.

"Historic district" or "historic landmark" means a building, property, or site, or group of buildings, properties, or sites that are either (i) listed in the National Register of Historic Places or formally determined eligible for listing by the Keeper of the National Register, the individual who has been delegated the authority by the federal agency to list properties and determine their eligibility for the National Register, in accordance with Section VI.D.1.a.i through Section VI.D.1.a.v of the Nationwide Programmatic Agreement codified at 47 CFR Part 1, Appendix C; or (ii) designated as a locally landmarked building, property, site, or historic district by an ordinance adopted by the Village pursuant to a preservation program that meets the requirements of the Certified Local Government Program of the Illinois State Historic Preservation Office or where such certification of the preservation program by the Illinois State Historic Preservation Office is pending.

"Law" means a federal or State statute, common law, code, rule, regulation, order, or local ordinance or resolution.

"Micro wireless facility" means a small wireless facility that is not larger in dimension than twenty-four (24) inches in length, fifteen (15) inches in width, and twelve (12) inches in height and that has an exterior antenna, if any, no longer than eleven (11) inches.

"Permit" means a written authorization required by the Village or other permitting authority to perform an action or initiate, continue, or complete a project.

"Person" means an individual, corporation, limited liability company, partnership, association, trust, or other entity or organization, including an authority.

"Public safety agency" means the functional division of the federal government, the State, a unit of local government, or a special purpose district located in whole or in part within this State, that provides or has authority to provide firefighting, police, ambulance, medical, or other emergency services to respond to and manage emergency incidents.

"Public Utility" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Section 3-105 of the Public Utilities Act, 220 ILCS 5/3-105.

"Rate" means a recurring charge.

"Right-of-way" means the area on, below, or above a public roadway, highway, street, public sidewalk, alley, or utility easement dedicated for compatible use. "Right-of-way" does not include authority-owned aerial lines.

"Small wireless facility" means a wireless facility that meets both of the following qualifications: (i) each antenna is located inside an enclosure of no more than six (6) cubic feet in volume or, in the case of an antenna that has exposed elements, the antenna and all of its exposed elements could fit within an imaginary enclosure of no more than six (6)

cubic feet; and (ii) all other wireless equipment attached directly to a utility pole associated with the facility is cumulatively no more than twenty-five (25) cubic feet in volume. The following types of associated ancillary equipment are not included in the calculation of equipment volume: electric meter, concealment elements, telecommunications demarcation box, ground-based enclosures, grounding equipment, power transfer switch, cut-off switch, and vertical cable runs for the connection of power and other services.

"Structural Engineer" means a person licensed under the laws of the State of Illinois to practice structural engineering.

"Utility pole" means a pole or similar structure that is used in whole or in part by a communications service provider or for electric distribution, lighting, traffic control, or a similar function.

"Village" means the Village of Palos Park, Cook County, Illinois.

"Village utility pole" means a utility pole owned or operated by the Village in public rights-of-way.

"Wireless facility" means equipment at a fixed location that enables wireless communications between user equipment and a communications network, including: (i) equipment associated with wireless communications; and (ii) radio transceivers, antennas, coaxial or fiber-optic cable, regular and backup power supplies, and comparable equipment, regardless of technological configuration. "Wireless facility" includes small wireless facilities. "Wireless facility" does not include: (i) the structure or improvements on, under, or within which the equipment is collocated; or (ii) wireline backhaul facilities, coaxial or fiber optic cable that is between wireless support structures or utility poles or coaxial, or fiber optic cable that is otherwise not immediately adjacent to or directly associated with an antenna.

"Wireless infrastructure provider" means any person authorized to provide telecommunications service in the State that builds or installs wireless communication transmission equipment, wireless facilities, wireless support structures, or utility poles and that is not a wireless services provider but is acting as an agent or a contractor for a wireless services provider for the application submitted to the Village.

"Wireless provider" means a wireless infrastructure provider and/or a wireless services provider. This does not include, and expressly excludes, any person who is providing service to or for a private niche market.

"Wireless services" means any services provided to the general public, including a particular class of customers, and made available on a nondiscriminatory basis using licensed or unlicensed spectrum, whether at a fixed location or mobile, provided using wireless facilities.

"Wireless services provider" means a person who provides wireless services.

"Wireless support structure" means a freestanding structure, such as a monopole; tower, either guyed or self-supporting; billboard; or other existing or proposed structure designed to support or capable of supporting wireless facilities. "Wireless support structure" does not include a utility pole.

**1032.04 ZONING.** Small wireless facilities shall be classified as permitted uses and shall not be subject to zoning review, if collocated in rights-of-way in any zoning district, or outside rights-of-way in the following zoning districts:

O Office District; and

M-1 Limited Manufacturing District.

In all other zoning districts, the Village's normal zoning approvals, processes and restrictions shall apply, if zoning approval, processes or restrictions are required by the Village's zoning ordinance.

**1032.05 PERMITS; APPLICATION PROCESS.** Unless otherwise specifically exempted in this chapter, a permit to collocate a small wireless facility within the Village is required in all cases. Permits are subject to the following:

A. Permit Applications: Permit applications for the collocation of small wireless facilities shall be made on a form provided by the Village for such purpose. In addition to any generally applicable information required of other communications service providers or for other installations in the public right-of-way, applicants must, when requesting to collocate small wireless facilities on a utility pole or wireless support structure, provide the following information:

1. Site specific structural integrity and, for a Village utility pole, make-ready analysis prepared by a structural engineer, as that term is defined in Section 4 of the Structural Engineering Practice Act of 1989;

2. The location where each proposed small wireless facility or utility pole would be installed and digital photographs of the location and its immediate surroundings depicting the utility poles or structures on which each proposed small wireless facility would be mounted or location where utility poles or structures would be installed. The photographs shall include a digital photo simulation of the proposed location providing "before and after" views demonstrating the true visual impact of the proposed small wireless facilities on the surrounding environment;

3. Specifications and drawings prepared by a structural engineer, as that term is defined in Section 4 of the Structural Engineering Practice Act of 1989, for each proposed small wireless facility covered by the application as it is proposed to be installed;

4. The equipment type and model numbers for the antennas and all other equipment associated with the small wireless facility;

5. A proposed schedule for the installation and completion of each small wireless facility covered by the application, if approved;

6. Certification that, to the best of the applicant's knowledge, the collocation complies with the written design standards established by the Village, and with the various other requirements set forth in this chapter and code;

7. Copies of all licenses, permits and approvals required by or from the Village (i.e. zoning approval, where required), other agencies and units of government with jurisdiction over the design, construction, location and operation of said small wireless facility. The applicant shall maintain such licenses, permits and approvals in full force and effect and provide evidence of renewal or extension thereof when granted; and

8. In the event the small wireless facility is proposed to be attached to an existing utility pole or wireless support structure owned by an entity other than the Village, legally competent evidence of the consent of the owner of such pole or wireless support structure to the proposed collocation.

B. Means of Submission: Permit applications, along with all supporting information, for the collocation of small wireless facilities shall be submitted by personal delivery or by other means approved by the Village.

C. Multiple Applications for Same Location: Multiple applications for collocation on the same utility pole or wireless support structure shall be processed based on a first fully complete application, first-served basis.

D. Permit Application Fees: All applications for collocation of small wireless facilities shall be accompanied by a nonrefundable application fee in the following amounts:

Request to collocate a small wireless facility that includes the installation of a new utility pole	\$1,000.00
Request to collocate a single small wireless facility on an existing utility pole or wireless support structure	\$650.00
Request to collocate multiple small wireless facilities on existing utility	\$350.00 per small wireless facility

poles or wireless support structures addressed in a single application	
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E. Permit review timelines:

1. **Completeness of Application:** Requests for the collocation of small wireless facilities shall be reviewed for conformance with the requirements of the Act, this chapter, and other applicable provisions of this code. Within thirty (30) days after receiving an application, the Village must determine whether the application is complete and notify the applicant. If an application is incomplete, the Village must specifically identify the missing information. Processing deadlines are tolled from the time the Village sends a notice of incompleteness to the time the applicant provides the missing information.

An application shall be deemed complete if the Village fails to provide notification to the applicant within thirty (30) days of the date when all documents, information, and fees specifically enumerated in the Village's permit application form are submitted by the applicant to the Village.

2. **Existing Pole or Wireless Support Structure:** Requests for the collocation of small wireless facilities on an existing utility pole or wireless support structure shall be processed on a nondiscriminatory basis and either approved or denied within ninety (90) days of submission of a completed application. A permit application shall be deemed approved if the Village fails to approve or deny the application within ninety (90) days, subject to the following: if an applicant intends to proceed with the permitted activity on a deemed approved basis, the applicant shall notify the Village in writing of its intention to invoke the deemed approved remedy no sooner than seventy-five (75) days after the submission of a completed application. The permit shall be deemed approved on the later of the ninetieth (90<sup>th</sup>) day after submission of the completed application, or the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) day after receipt of the deemed approved notice by the Village. Receipt of a deemed approved notice by the Village shall not preclude the Village from denying the permit within the allowed time limit.

3. **New Utility Pole:** Requests for the collocation of small wireless facilities that include the installation of a new utility pole shall be processed on a nondiscriminatory basis and either approved or denied within one hundred and twenty (120) days of submission of a completed application. A permit application shall be deemed approved if the Village fails to approve or deny the application within one hundred twenty (120) days, subject to the following: if an applicant intends to proceed with the permitted activity on a deemed approved basis, the applicant shall notify the Village in writing of its intention to invoke the deemed approved remedy no sooner than one hundred five (105) days after the submission of a completed application. The permit shall be deemed approved on the

later of the one hundred twentieth (120<sup>th</sup>) day after submission of the completed application, or the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) day after receipt of the deemed approved notice by the Village. Receipt of a deemed approved notice by the Village shall not preclude the Village from denying the permit within the allowed time limit.

F. Tolling: The time limitations for approval or denial of applications shall be tolled by notice to an applicant that its application is incomplete as set forth above, upon mutual agreement of the parties, or by a local, State or federal disaster declaration or similar emergency that causes a delay.

G. Pole Replacement: Permit approval shall be conditioned on the replacement of a utility pole or wireless support structure at the applicant's sole cost where such replacement is deemed necessary for compliance with the requirements of this chapter or code relative to the siting of small wireless facilities, or other applicable codes and regulations that concern public safety.

H. Denial: The Village shall deny an application that does not meet the requirements of this chapter. The reasons for any denial of a permit shall be provided in a written notice of denial sent to the applicant, and shall include the specific code provisions or application conditions on which the denial is based.

I. Resubmittal After Denial: In the case of a permit denial, an applicant may cure the deficiencies identified in the notice of denial and resubmit a revised application once within thirty (30) days after the notice of denial is sent without payment of an additional application fee. The Village shall have thirty (30) days to approve or deny the resubmitted application or it is deemed approved, if the applicant has notified the Village of its intention to proceed with the permitted activity on a deemed approved basis, which notification may be submitted with the resubmitted application. Review of a resubmitted application is limited to the deficiencies cited in the original notice of denial. This subsection does not apply if a revised application is not resubmitted within thirty (30) days, or curing any deficiencies in the original application requires review of a new location, new or different structure for collocation, new antennas, or other wireless equipment associated with the small wireless facility. In such cases, a new application and application fee are required.

J. Consolidated Applications: Consolidated applications for small wireless facilities for the collocation of up to twenty-five (25) small wireless facilities shall be allowed if the collocations each involve substantially the same type of small wireless facility and substantially the same type of structure. Each consolidated application shall provide all the information required by this chapter for each small wireless facility at each location. If such an application includes incomplete information for one or more small wireless facility collocations, or includes requests for small wireless facilities that do not qualify for consolidated treatment, or that are otherwise denied, the Village may remove such

collocation requests from the application and treat them as separate requests. Separate permits may be issued for each collocation approved in a consolidated application.

K. **Alternate Locations:** If an applicant is seeking to install a new utility pole as part of its application, the Village may propose that the small wireless facility be located on an existing utility pole or existing wireless support structure within one hundred (100) feet of the proposed collocation. The applicant shall accept the proposed alternate location so long as it has the right to use the location on reasonable terms and conditions, unless the alternate location imposes technical limits or additional material costs as determined by the applicant. If the applicant refuses an alternate location based on the foregoing, the applicant shall provide legally competent evidence in the form of a written certification, under oath, describing the property rights, technical limits or material cost reasons that prevent the alternate location from being utilized.

L. **Exemptions:** No application, permit approval or fee shall be required from a communications service provider authorized to occupy the right-of-way when the work in question is for:

1. Routine maintenance not requiring replacement of wireless facilities if the wireless provider notifies the Village in writing at least forty-eight hours prior to the planned maintenance;

2. The replacement of wireless facilities with wireless facilities that are substantially similar, the same size, or smaller if the wireless provider notifies the Village in writing at least ten (10) days prior to the planned replacement and includes equipment specifications, including (i) equipment type and model numbers, for the replacement of equipment consistent with the equipment specifications information required on a permit application for original installation; and (ii) information sufficient to establish that the replacement is substantially similar. The wireless provider shall provide all information necessary and requested by the Village to establish that the replacement is substantially similar. The Village has the sole right and responsibility to determine if a proposed small wireless facility is substantially similar to the existing small wireless facility; or

3. The installation, placement, maintenance, operation or replacement of micro wireless facilities that are suspended on cables that are strung between existing utility poles in compliance with applicable safety codes.

The foregoing shall not exempt communications service providers from Village permitting requirements where traffic patterns are affected or lane closures are required.

**1032.06 CONSTRUCTION.** Collocations for which permits are approved shall be completed within one hundred eighty (180) days of issuance of the permit, unless the Village agrees to extend the period or a delay is caused by make-ready work for a Village utility

pole or by the lack of commercial power or backhaul availability at the site, provided the applicant has made a timely request within sixty (60) days after the issuance of the permit for commercial power or backhaul services, and the additional time to complete installation does not exceed three hundred sixty (360) days after issuance of the permit. Permits that are not completed within applicable timelines shall be void absent an extension granted in writing by the Village.

**1032.07 PERMIT DURATION.** Permits issued for small wireless facilities pursuant to this chapter shall be valid for a period of five (5) years. Permits are subject to renewal at the end of the five (5) year permit period for a successive five (5) year term so long as the installation complies with the applicable code provisions in force at the time of renewal. A finding by the Village at the time of a request for renewal that an installation does not comply with the applicable code provisions in force at the time of the renewal request shall be in writing. If the Act is repealed or found unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, all permits granted by the Village under this chapter shall terminate at the end of their current term.

**1032.08 HEIGHT LIMITATIONS.**

A. Antenna Installations: The maximum permitted height of a small wireless facility is ten (10) feet above the utility pole or wireless support structure on which the small wireless facility is collocated.

B. New Poles: The maximum permitted height of new or replacement utility pole or wireless support structure on which a small wireless facility is collocated is the higher of:

1. Ten (10) feet in height above the tallest existing utility pole, other than a utility pole supporting only wireless facilities, that is in place on the date the application is submitted, and that is located within three hundred (300) feet of the new or replacement utility pole or wireless support structure and that is in the same right-of-way within the Village. In cases where a location is at the intersection of two (2) or more rights-of-way, the Village may designate which intersecting right-of-way within three hundred (300) feet of the proposed utility pole or wireless support structures shall control the height limitation for such facility; or

2. Forty-five (45) feet above ground level.

C. Variance Process:

A Wireless provider may receive a variance from the public works director pursuant to the procedures set forth in section 1030.21 (Variances) of chapter 1030 (Construction of Utility Facilities in the Rights-of-Way) of this code, from the maximum permitted height of a new

pole set forth in this section, if the wireless provider, in addition to demonstrating the conditions set forth in section 1030.21 have been established, can establish that:

1. Because of a particular unusual condition, a particular hardship or practical difficulty to the wireless provider would result, as distinguished from a mere inconvenience, and such hardship or difficulty has not been created by the wireless provider; and

2. Existing utility poles or wireless support structures, or a new utility pole at the maximum permitted height for a new pole allowed by this section cannot accommodate the wireless facility at a height necessary to function effectively, under reasonable terms and conditions; and

3. The use of existing utility poles or other wireless support structures, or a new utility pole at the maximum permitted height for a new pole allowed by this section, is not technically feasible.

#### **1032.09 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS.**

A. Public Safety Technology: A wireless provider's operation of a small wireless facility may not interfere with the frequencies used by a public safety agency for public safety communications. A wireless provider must install small wireless facilities of the type and frequency that will not cause unacceptable interference with a public safety agency's communications equipment. Unacceptable interference is determined by and measured in accordance with industry standards and the FCC's regulations addressing unacceptable interference to public safety spectrum or any other spectrum licenses by a public safety agency. If a small wireless facility causes such interference, and the wireless provider has been given written notice of the interference by the public safety agency, the wireless provider, at its own expense, shall take all reasonable steps necessary to correct and eliminate the interference, including, but not limited to, powering down the small wireless facility and later powering up the small wireless facility for intermittent testing, if necessary. The Village may terminate a permit for a small wireless facility based on such interference if the wireless provider is not making a good faith effort to remedy the problem in a manner consistent with the abatement and resolution procedures for interference with public safety spectrum established by the FCC, including 47 CFR 22.970 through 47 CFR 22.973 and 47 CFR 90.672 through 47 CFR 90.675. The burden to establish the good faith effort shall be on the wireless provider, which shall timely deliver to the Village all information necessary to demonstrate its efforts to resolve the interference consistent with the Code of Federal Regulations sections cited above. Failure to remedy the interference as required herein shall constitute a public nuisance and the small wireless facility may be abated through the procedures for abatement of such nuisances set forth in this code.

B. A wireless provider shall not construct or maintain any small wireless facility that:

1. Obstructs, impedes or hinders the usual travel or public safety on a right-of-way;

2. Obstructs the legal use of right-of-way by utility users;
3. Violates nondiscriminatory applicable codes;
4. Violates or conflicts with chapter 1030 (Construction of Utility Facilities in the Rights-of-Way), or other applicable regulations set forth in this code, except to the extent such chapters, sections or regulations may be modified by the provisions of this chapter; or
5. Violates the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. Section 12101 *et seq.*)

C. Contractual Requirements: Wireless providers shall comply with all requirements imposed by a contract between the Village and any private property owner that concern design or construction standards applicable to utility poles and ground-mounted equipment located in the right-of-way.

D. Ground-Mounted Equipment: Wireless providers shall comply with the ground mounted equipment spacing requirements within rights-of-way, if any, as set forth in chapter 1030 (Construction of Utility Facilities in the Rights-of-Way) of this code. E. Undergrounding:

1. The wireless provider shall comply with Village code provisions or regulations concerning undergrounding requirements, if any, that prohibit the installation of new or the modification of existing utility poles or equipment in the right-of-way.

2. A Wireless Provider may receive a variance from the public works director, pursuant to the procedures set forth in section 1030.21 (Variances) of chapter 1030 (Construction of Utility Facilities in the Rights-of-Way) of this code, to allow a small wireless facility to be located above ground in an area where Village ordinances or regulations prohibit or restrict above ground facilities if, in addition to demonstrating the conditions of section 1030.21 have been established, the wireless provider can establish that:

- a. Underground equipment is not technically feasible and there is no reasonable alternative or location that is more aesthetically favorable to adjacent property owners and to effective use and management of the right-of-way; and

- b. An above ground small wireless facility at the proposed location is necessary at the proposed location to provide coverage in a specified area; and

- c. An above ground small wireless facility at the proposed location will not disrupt traffic or pedestrian circulation or constitute a safety hazard; and

d. An above small ground wireless facility at the proposed location will not interfere with public safety uses or frequencies; and

e. Space exists within the public right-of-way to accommodate the above ground small wireless facility at the proposed location; and

f. An above ground small wireless facility at the proposed location will not create a safety hazard; and

g. The above ground small wireless facility is located and designed in such a way so as to minimize its visual impact on adjacent properties; and

h. In any historical area, that the above ground small wireless facility will not detrimentally affect the historical nature of the area.

3. Screening for Ground Mounted Facilities. Where a ground-mounted facility is allowed, such equipment shall be screened around the perimeter in accordance with a landscape plan sealed by a professional landscape engineer. Plant materials shall include a mixture of deciduous and coniferous planting materials. The owner or wireless provider shall be responsible for maintenance of all landscaping as provided in the approved landscape plan.

4. Future Undergrounding: The Village may, from time to time, make a decision to eliminate above-ground utility poles of a particular type generally, such as electric utility poles, in all or a significant portion of the Village. In the event that such a utility pole has a collocated small wireless facility in place at the time of such a decision, the Village shall either:

a. Continue to maintain the utility pole, or install and maintain a reasonable utility pole or wireless support structure for the collocation of the small wireless facility; or

b. Offer to sell the utility pole to the wireless provider at a reasonable cost, or allow the wireless provider to install its own utility pole so it can maintain service from that location.

F. Collocation Limits: Wireless providers shall not collocate small wireless facilities on Village utility poles that are part of an electric distribution or transmission system within the communication worker safety zone of the pole or the electric supply zone of the pole.

However, the antenna and support equipment of the small wireless facility may be located in the communications space on the Village utility pole and on the top of the pole, if not otherwise unavailable, if the wireless provider complies with applicable codes for work involving the top of the pole.

For purposes of this subsection, the terms "communications space", "communication worker safety zone", and "electric supply zone" have the meanings given to those terms in the National Electric Safety Code as published by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers.

G. Code Compliance: Wireless providers shall comply with applicable codes and local code provisions or regulations that concern public safety.

**1032.10 STEALTH, CONCEALMENT AND DESIGN STANDARDS.** Every small wireless facility installation shall comply with the following standards:

A. General Stealth, Concealment and Design Standards: Installations shall comply with any stealth, concealment, design and aesthetic standards applicable to utility installations in the public right-of-way, as set forth in chapter 1030 (Construction of Utility Facilities in the Rights-of-Way) of this code, as well as any written design standards that are generally applicable for decorative utility poles, or reasonable stealth, concealment, design and aesthetic requirements that are otherwise identified by the Village in an ordinance, written policy adopted by the Village Council, in the Village's comprehensive plan, or in a written design plan that applies to other occupiers of the rights-of-way, including on a historic landmark or in a historic district.

B. Historic Districts and Landmarks: For areas designated as historic districts, or on buildings or structures designated as either national historic landmarks or as landmarks pursuant to chapter 1490 of this code, in addition to the stealth, concealment and design requirements referenced above, the following additional restrictions/conditions apply to the installation of small wireless facilities:

1. Small wireless facilities shall be comprised of materials that are consistent with the surrounding elements so as to blend architecturally with any buildings or structures designated as historic landmarks or located within a designated historic district, and shall be designed to blend with the surrounding historical landmarks and/or district in design and color.

2. Small wireless facilities shall not be mounted upon designated historic landmarks.

C. Limitations:

1. Any stealth, concealment and design standards, including restrictions on a specific category of utility poles, may not have the effect of prohibiting any provider's technology. Such stealth, concealment and design measures shall not be considered a part of the small wireless facility for purposes of the size restrictions of a small wireless facility.

2. This subsection shall not be construed to limit the Village's enforcement of historic preservation in conformance with the requirements adopted pursuant to the Illinois State Agency Historic Resources Preservation Act or the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, 54 U.S.C. Section 300101 *et seq.*, and the regulations adopted to implement those laws.

**1032.11. RESERVATION OF VILLAGE UTILITY POLE SPACE.** The Village may reserve space on Village-owned utility poles for future public safety uses or for Village electric utility uses. Such reservation may preclude collocation of small wireless facilities if the Village reasonably determines that the Village's utility pole cannot accommodate both uses.

**1032.12 APPLICABILITY OF EXISTING AGREEMENTS.**

A. Existing Installations: Subject to any applicable termination provisions, where an existing agreement is in place between the Village and a wireless provider relating to the collocation of small wireless facilities on Village utility poles on June 1, 2018, such agreement shall remain in effect for all small wireless facilities collocated on the Village's utility poles pursuant to applications submitted prior to June 1, 2018.

B. Applications Received Between June 1, 2018 and June 1, 2020: Subject to any applicable termination provisions, where an existing agreement is in place between the Village and a wireless provider relating to the collocation of small wireless facilities on Village utility poles on June 1, 2018, such agreement shall remain in effect for all small wireless facilities collocated on the Village's utility poles pursuant to applications submitted after June 1, 2018, but prior to June 1, 2020, until June 1, 2020 or receipt by the Village from the wireless provider of a notice that it is opting to accept the rates, fees and terms of this chapter and the Act received after June 1, 2020, whichever is later.

C. Applications Received After June 1, 2020: Subject to any applicable termination provisions, where an existing agreement is in place between the Village and a wireless provider relating to the collocation of small wireless facilities on Village utility poles on June 1, 2018, such agreement shall remain in effect for all small wireless facilities collocated on the Village's utility poles pursuant to applications submitted after June 1, 2020, until receipt by the Village of a notice from the wireless provider that it is accepting the rates, fees, terms and conditions of this chapter.

**1032.13 COLLOCATION ON VILLAGE OWNED INFRASTRUCTURE.**

A. Fee: The annual fee to collocate a small wireless facility on a Village-owned utility pole located in a right-of-way shall be the higher of:

1. \$200/year per small wireless facility; or

2. The actual, direct, and reasonable costs related to the wireless providers use of space on the pole.

B. Exception: Small wireless facilities collocated on Village-owned utility poles located outside of public right-of-way are not subject to the rate limitations in this section.

C. Attachment Agreement: An attachment agreement in a form approved by the Village is required for any collocation upon any Village owned utility pole or wireless support structure.

**1032.14 NOTICE OF SALE OR TRANSFER.** A wireless provider shall, prior to any sale or transfer of ownership or control of a small wireless facility located within the jurisdiction of the Village, provide written notice to the Village of such sale or transfer of control. Such notice shall include the name and contact information of the new wireless provider.

**1032.15 ABANDONMENT.**

A. A small wireless facility that is not operated for a continuous period of twelve (12) months shall be considered abandoned and the owner of the facility shall remove the small wireless facility within ninety (90) days after receipt of written notice from the Village notifying it of the abandonment. The notice shall be sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, by the Village to the owner at its last known address. If the small wireless facility is not removed within ninety (90) days after receipt of such notice, such wireless facility shall be deemed to be a nuisance and the Village may remove or cause the removal of such facility, and recover or place a lien for its costs, pursuant to the terms of its pole attachment or other agreement for Village utility poles or through the procedures for abatement of nuisances set forth in this code.

B. In the event the Village suspects that the wireless provider is no longer using the small wireless facilities to provide wireless service, it may send the wireless provider written notice that requires the wireless provider to remove the small wireless facility or provide proof that the small wireless facility is operational and still being used within thirty (30) days, and informs the wireless provider that failure to provide proof or to remove the small wireless facility will result in the Village removing the small wireless facility at the wireless provider's cost.

**1032.16 DISPUTE RESOLUTION.**

The Circuit Court of Cook County shall have exclusive jurisdiction to resolve all disputes arising under the Act. Pending resolution of a dispute concerning rates for collocation of small wireless facilities on Village utility poles within the right-of-way, the Village shall allow the collocating person to collocate on its poles at annual rates of no more than \$200 per year per pole, with rates to be determined upon final resolution of the dispute.

**1032.17 INDEMNIFICATION.** Other than for liabilities and losses due to or caused by the sole negligence of the Village or its employees or agents, a wireless provider shall indemnify and hold the Village harmless against any and all liability or loss from personal injury or property damage resulting from or arising out of, in whole or in part, the use or occupancy of the Village infrastructure or improvements, or right-of-way associated with such infrastructure or improvements by the wireless provider or its employees, agents, or contractors arising out of the rights and privileges granted under this chapter and the Act. A wireless provider proceeding under this chapter waives any claims it may have against the Village with respect to consequential, incidental, or special damages, however caused, based on the theory of liability.

**1032.18 INSURANCE.** At all times during the period in which a wireless provider's facilities are located on Village infrastructure, improvements or in right-of-way, the wireless provider shall, at its own sole cost and expense, carry the following insurance coverages:

- A. Property insurance for its property's replacement cost against all risks;
- B. Workers' Compensation insurance within statutory limits as required by law; and
- C. Commercial general liability insurance with respect to its activities on the Village infrastructure, improvements or rights-of-way, including coverage for bodily injury and property damage, with limits not less than:
  - 1. Five million dollars for bodily injury or death to each person;
  - 2. Five million dollars for property damage resulting from any one accident;and
  - 3. Five million dollars for all other types of liability.

The wireless provider shall include the Village as an additional insured on the commercial general liability policy and shall provide certificates of insurance and proof of inclusion of the Village in a commercial general liability policy to the Village prior to the collocation of any small wireless facility, and shall keep updated certificates and proof of inclusion on file with the Village at all times that the provider maintains small wireless facilities within the Village.

D. A wireless provider may self-insure all or a portion of the insurance coverage and limits required by the Village. A wireless provider that self-insures is not required, to the extent of the self-insurance, to comply with the requirement that the Village be named an additional insured. A wireless provider that self-insures shall provide to the Village evidence sufficient to demonstrate its financial ability to self-insure the insurance limits required by the Village.

**1032.19 MAINTENANCE OF SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES.**

A. A wireless provider shall maintain all small wireless facilities installed within the Village in a condition that maintains the safety, integrity and aesthetics of such facilities. Small wireless facilities shall not appear to be unkempt. In the event of a failure to properly maintain such facilities, the Village shall notify the wireless provider, in writing, who shall have thirty (30) days to correct the identified maintenance violation. If not corrected within such period, the Village reserves the right to take such action as it deems necessary, including revocation of the permit. Maintenance and replacement of small wireless facilities shall be performed by the wireless provider at the wireless provider's sole cost and expense.

B. In the event of an emergency involving an imminent threat to life or property, the Village may take corrective action to eliminate such emergency at the wireless provider's expense.

### **1032.20 REVOCATION OF PERMIT.**

A. A permit to collocate a small wireless facility may be revoked for one or more of the following reasons:

1. The wireless provider obtained approval by means of fraud or made a misrepresentation of a material fact with respect to the permit application, or any required documentation or submittal.

2. The wireless provider failed to construct the small wireless facility in accordance with the approved plans.

3. The wireless provider failed to comply within any material condition of a permit issued.

4. The wireless provider substantially expanded or altered the use or the structure of the small wireless facility beyond what was requested in the permit application or approved, without the approval of the Village.

5. The wireless provider failed to notify the Village of the replacement of small wireless facilities as required by this chapter.

6. A substantial change of law has occurred affecting the wireless provider's authority to occupy or use the property upon which the small wireless facility is located.

7. The small wireless facility interferes with vehicular or pedestrian use of the public right of way.

8. The wireless provider has failed to make a safe and timely restoration of the right-of-way or the property upon which the small wireless facility is located.

9. The wireless provider has failed to properly maintain the small wireless facility as required by this chapter.

10. The wireless provider has failed to abate interference with public safety communications in a manner consistent with the abatement and resolution procedures for interference with public safety spectrum established by the FCC including 47 CFR 22.970 through 47 CFR 22.973 and 47 CFR 90.672 through 47 CFR 90.675.

11. The small wireless facility has been abandoned and the wireless provider has failed to remove the small wireless facility as provided in this chapter.

B. Written notification of the permit revocation shall be sent by certified mail or shall be personally delivered to the wireless provider setting forth the basis for the revocation. The wireless provider shall, within fourteen days of the notice of revocation, file a written response with the public works director setting forth the reasons why the permit should not be revoked along with such evidence in opposition to the revocation as the wireless provider determines necessary. Failure to file a response with the public works director shall be deemed an admission of the facts set forth in the notification of written notification and shall result in automatic revocation of the permit. The public works director shall render findings and a decision within twenty-one days of the date of receipt of the wireless provider's response, if any.

C. If the public works director revokes the permit, the wireless provider may file a written notice of appeal with the Village Clerk within twenty-one (21) days of notification of the permit revocation. Such notice shall contain a response to the decision of the public works director. The Village Council shall hear the revocation appeal and render a decision on such appeal.

#### **1032.21 EXCEPTIONS TO APPLICABILITY.**

A. Nothing in this chapter authorizes the collocation of small wireless facilities on:

1. Property owned by a private party without the written consent of the property owner;

2. Property owned or controlled by a unit of local government that is not located within rights-of-way without the written consent of the unit of local government (local governments are, however, required to authorize the collocation of small wireless facilities on utility poles owned or controlled by the local government or located within rights-of-way to the same extent the local government permits access to utility poles for other commercial projects or uses);

3. A privately-owned utility pole or wireless support structure, without the consent of the property owner;

4. Property owned, leased or controlled by a park district, forest preserve district, or conservation district for public park, recreation or conservation purposes, without the consent of the affected district, excluding the placement of facilities on rights-of-way located in an affected district that are under the jurisdiction and control of a different unit of local government as provided by the Illinois Highway Code (605 ILCS 5/1-101 *et seq.*); or

5. Property owned by a rail carrier registered under Section 18c-7201 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/18c-7201), Metra Commuter Rail or any other public commuter rail service, or an electric utility as defined in Section 16-102 of the Public Utilities Act (220 ILCS 5/16-102), without the consent of the rail carrier, public commuter rail service, or electric utility;

B. The provisions of this chapter do not apply to:

1. Facilities of an electric or gas public utility or such utility's wireless facilities if the facilities are being used, developed and maintained consistent with the provisions of subsection (i) of Section 16-108.5 of the Public Utilities Act; or

2. Small wireless facilities owned by the Village.

**SECTION 3:** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby expressly repealed.

**SECTION 4:** Except as to the Code amendments set forth above in this Ordinance, all Chapters and Sections of the Village Code, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 5:** Each section, paragraph, clause and provision of this Ordinance is separable, and if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance, nor any part thereof, other than that part affected by such decision.

**SECTION 6:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2018 – R – 07**

**RESOLUTION ADOPTING WRITTEN DESIGN STANDARDS FOR SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES**

**WHEREAS**, Public Act 100-585, known as the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act, approved by the Governor on April 12, 2018, with an effective date of June 1, 2018, acts to impose certain additional requirements on municipalities, including the Village, regarding the permitting, construction, deployment, regulation, operation, maintenance, repair and removal of certain defined small wireless facilities both within public rights-of-way and in other locations within the jurisdiction of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Village Council have adopted Chapter 1032 (Small Wireless Facilities) of the Palos Park Village Code in order to regulate the permitting, construction, deployment, regulation, operation, maintenance, repair and removal of small wireless facilities in conformance with the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act; and

**WHEREAS**, both the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act and Chapter 1032 of the Palos Park Village Code authorize the adoption of written design standards governing the installation of small wireless facilities and associated wireless support structures within the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Village Council find it to be in the best interests of the Village to adopt, as the written design standards of the Village, the General Guidelines and Small Wireless Facility Design, Stealth and Concealment Standards for small wireless facilities attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and made a part hereof.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Village Council of the Village of Palos Park, Cook County, Illinois, that the General Guidelines and Small Wireless Facility

Design, Stealth and Concealment Standards attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and made a part hereof are hereby approved and adopted as the written design standards of the Village.

### General Guidelines and Small Wireless Facility Design, Stealth and Concealment Standards

The following general guidelines and design, stealth and concealment standards apply to the placement of small wireless facilities within the Village. Small Wireless Facilities are generally regulated by Chapter 1032 of the Village Code and all terms used herein are as defined in that Chapter.

General Standards. Every small wireless facility collocation shall comply with the following standards.

A. Small wireless facilities:

1. Antennas shall be mounted no less than twelve (12) feet above ground level.
2. Antennas shall, to the extent technically feasible, be designed and installed to appear hidden within the utility pole or to appear like an original part of the utility pole or wireless support structure.
3. Each antenna not hidden within a utility pole shall be located entirely within a shroud enclosure not more than six (6) cubic feet in volume that is capable of accepting paint to match the approved color of the small wireless facility.
4. Top-mounted antennas and their enclosures shall not extend the diameter of the utility pole or wireless support structure at the level of the antenna attachment.
5. Side-mounted small wireless facility antennas within a shroud enclosure and side-mounted small wireless facility equipment enclosures shall be, if possible, flush mounted to the utility pole or wireless support structure at the level of the attachment. Metal flaps or "wings" shall extend from the enclosure to the utility pole or wireless support structure to conceal any gap between the between the small wireless facility and the utility pole or wireless support structure. The design of the flaps shall be integrated with the design of the small wireless facility.
6. Small wireless facilities located on street light poles or traffic control structures shall not block light emanating from the street light fixture

or otherwise interfere with the purpose of the street light fixture or traffic control structure.

7. Small wireless facilities shall be attached to the utility pole or wireless support structure using rigid steel clamping mounts or stainless steel banding to the exterior of any metal pole. All mounts and banding shall be of the same color as the utility pole or wireless support structure, except as otherwise approved by the Village Engineer. Care should be taken to integrate the mounting elements into the small wireless facility design. Through-bolting or use of lag bolts on Village-owned utility poles is prohibited.
8. For attachments to existing utility poles, wires serving the small wireless facility shall be concealed within the hollow interior of the utility pole, or if concealment is not technically feasible, flush mounted to an existing utility pole in an enclosed wire chase on which the facilities are collocated. For new utility poles or wireless support structures, wires serving the small wireless facility shall be concealed within the hollow interior of the utility pole or wireless support structure.
9. All small wireless facilities shall be installed in accordance with all applicable Village codes. No wiring or cabling shall interfere with any existing wiring or cabling installed by the Village, a utility or a wireless services provider.
10. No guy or other support wires will be used in connection with a small wireless facility unless the small wireless facility is to be attached to an existing utility pole or wireless support structure that incorporates guy wires prior to the date the applicant has applied for a permit.
11. The small wireless facility, including the antenna, and all related equipment when attached to an existing or new utility pole or wireless support structure, must be designed to withstand a wind force and ice loads in accordance with the applicable standards established in Chapter 25 of the National Electric Safety Code for utility poles, Rule 250-B and 250-C standards governing wind, ice, and loading forces on utility poles, in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) in TIA/EIA Section 222-G established by the Telecommunications Industry Association (TIA) and the Electronics Industry Association (EIA) for steel wireless support structures and the applicable industry standard for other existing structures. For any

small wireless facility attached to a Village-owned utility pole or, in the discretion of the Village, to a non Village-owned utility pole or wireless support structure, the operator of the small wireless facility must provide the Village with a structural evaluation of each specific location containing a recommendation that the proposed installation passes the standards described above. The evaluation must be prepared by a professional structural engineer licensed in the State of Illinois.

12. The Village will not authorize any attachments of small wireless facilities to a Village-owned utility pole that negatively impacts the structural integrity of the pole. The Village may condition approval of the collocation on replacement or modification of the Village-owned utility pole if necessary to meet Village standards.
13. Small wireless facilities shall be located in a manner that meets the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and does not obstruct, impede or hinder the usual pedestrian or vehicular path of travel.
14. Small wireless facilities collocated on Village-owned utility poles may not use the same power or communication source providing power and/or communication for the existing infrastructure. The wireless provider shall coordinate, establish, maintain and pay for all power and communication connections with private utilities.
15. A four (4) inch by six (6) inch plate with the wireless provider's name, location identifying information, and emergency telephone number shall be permanently fixed to the small wireless facility equipment enclosure or shroud.

**B. Replacement of Existing Street Light Poles**

The following standards apply when replacing an existing street light pole with a combination small wireless facility and street light pole. Such replacements should only be located where an existing street light pole can be removed and replaced. The Village currently has few street lights. New street lights may only be placed where the Village has determined a street light is desirable. All such replacements and new street lights shall meet the following standards:

1. All replacement street light poles shall be a similar design, material, and color as the replaced existing street light pole and other poles within the immediate area.

2. All replacement street light poles and pole foundations shall conform to the Village's standards and specifications for street light design and construction, if any.
3. Replacement street light poles shall be an equal distance from other street light poles based upon the average distance between existing street light poles within the designated area.
4. Street light poles shall be designed and engineered to support a luminaire and mast arm of length equal to that of the existing pole to be replaced or of a length approved by the Village Engineer based upon the location of the replacement street light pole.
5. All luminaires and mast arms shall match the arc and style of the original luminaire and mast arm, unless otherwise approved by the Village Engineer.
6. The replacement luminaire and mast arm shall be at the same height above the ground as the existing luminaire and mast arm.
7. All replacement street light poles shall have new light emitting diode (LED) light fixtures of the same manufacturer, model and light output as the removed fixture and nearby light fixtures, or as otherwise approved by the Village Engineer.
8. Replacement street light poles shall have a five (5) year manufacturer's replacement warranty.
9. Replacement street light poles shall meet American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials structural guidelines for roadway applications and the American National Standards Institute requirements for vibrations.
10. Street light pole height shall be measured from the ground to the top of the street light pole.
11. All replacement street light pole heights shall be consistent with those of existing street lights.
12. The small wireless facility components shall be sized appropriately to the scale of the street light pole.
13. A decorative transition shall be installed over the equipment enclosure upper bolts, or a decorative base cover shall be installed to match the equipment enclosure size. All hardware connections shall

be hidden from view. Each street light pole component shall be architecturally compatible to create a cohesive aesthetic.

14. Replacement street light poles shall continue to be owned by the Village.

C. Installation of new wireless support structures, where allowed.

1. A new wireless support structure shall be designed to minimize the visual and aesthetic impact of the new vertical element and associated small wireless facilities upon the surrounding area and shall blend in with the surrounding streetscape with minimal visual impact. The Village may require a new wireless support structure to be constructed of a specific material that will enhance the stealth and concealment of the structure.
2. New wireless support structures shall match the design, type, material and color of existing utility poles, including street light poles, within the immediate area, except as otherwise approved by the Village Engineer.
3. Within residentially zoned areas, new wireless support structure installations shall be located where the shared property line between two residential parcels intersect the right-of-way whenever possible, unless an unsafe condition, cluttered appearance, or other violation of these standards will result.
4. New wireless support structures shall be equal distance from other utility poles based upon the average distance between existing utility poles within the designated area. If a new wireless support structure cannot be located the average distance from other utility poles, a new wireless support structure may be approved if such wireless support structure is designed as a stealth pole.
5. The centerline of a new wireless support structure shall be in alignment with existing utility poles where present, or with street or parkway trees along the same side of the right-of-way.
6. New wireless support structures shall be located a minimum of twelve (12) feet from driveway aprons.
7. New wireless support structures shall be sited outside the critical root zone of existing trees having a six (6) inch diameter at breast height located in the immediate vicinity.

8. The outside diameter of any new wireless support structure shall not exceed the diameter of existing utility poles located within 300 feet of the location of the new wireless support structure.
9. New wireless support structures shall not exceed the heights as authorized by Chapter 1032 of the Village Code.
10. New wireless support structures shall be round in shape with a smooth pole shaft.
11. New wireless support structures incorporating pole-mounted small wireless facilities shall be tapered in diameter from the base to the top, with a maximum diameter of twelve (12) inches at the base and a maximum diameter of eight (8) inches at the top.
12. New wireless support structures incorporating small wireless facilities in an equipment enclosure within a base may utilize poles tapered in diameter or poles having a consistent outside diameter.
13. All new wireless support structures must be supported with a reinforced concrete foundation designed, stamped, sealed and signed by a professional engineer licensed and registered in the State of Illinois, and subject to the Village Engineer's approval.
14. All anchor bolts must be concealed from public view, with an appropriate pole boot or cover powder-coated to match the wireless support structure color.
15. If multiple requests are received to install two (2) or more wireless support structures in approximately the same location, in a manner that would violate these requirements or other Village requirements, the Village shall resolve such conflict through whatever reasonable and nondiscriminatory manner it deems appropriate. Collocation of multiple small wireless facilities on a wireless support structure is encouraged in order to minimize the number of new wireless support structures within the Village.

D. Stealth and Concealment Requirements.

Wireless providers shall comply with the design and construction standards that are generally applicable to utility installations in the public right-of-way, as set forth in Chapter 1030 of the Village, as well as these standards, any other written design standards for decorative utility poles, or reasonable stealth, concealment, and aesthetic requirements that are otherwise

identified by the Village in an ordinance, written policy adopted by the Village Board of Trustees, in the Village's comprehensive plan, or in another written design plan that applies to other occupiers of the rights-of-way, including on a historic landmark or in a historic district. In addition:

1. The use of stealth technology in the location and construction of small wireless facilities is required whenever and wherever possible. Stealth technology means using the least visually and physically intrusive design and equipment that is not technologically or commercially impracticable under the facts and circumstances, to employ methods that blend into surroundings and not be visible; and to minimize adverse aesthetic and visual impacts on the right-of-way, property, building and/or other facilities adjacent to, surrounding and in generally the same area as the requested location of such small wireless facilities.
2. Small wireless facilities, including but not limited to antennas, equipment enclosures, mounting brackets and hardware, mounting posts, cables, and shrouds, shall be of a color that is identical to the utility pole or of a neutral color compatible with the color of the utility pole and any surrounding elements so as to camouflage or conceal their appearance, create consistency among right-of-way infrastructure, and to make such small wireless facilities as unobtrusive as possible. The Village Engineer may approve compatible color schemes for antennas and small wireless facilities.
3. Mechanical equipment and devices shall be concealed underground, mounted within a concealment box designed as a decorative pole base or within unobtrusive equipment enclosures or other devices mounted directly to the pole a minimum of eight (8) feet above ground level and screened by approved concealment methods.
4. Small wireless facilities must be located and oriented in such a way as to minimize view blockage.
5. The wireless provider shall use the smallest suitable wireless facilities then in industry use, regardless of location, for the particular application.
6. Additional landscaping and fencing shall be required to help mitigate the effects of the installation of any ground-mounted equipment.

7. Small wireless facilities shall not be artificially lighted or marked, except as required by law.
8. Small wireless facilities, other than top-mounted antennas, shall be mounted on the side of the utility pole or wireless support structure opposite the direction of vehicular traffic along the same side of the right-of-way.
9. Alternative measures for concealment may be proposed by the wireless provider and approved by the Village Engineer, if the Village Engineer determines that the optional measures will be at least as effective in concealing the small wireless facilities as the measures required above.

E. Historic District or Historic Landmark Limitations:

1. The above design or concealment measures with respect to a historic district or historic landmark, including restrictions on a specific category of utility poles, may not have the effect of prohibiting any provider's technology. Such design and concealment measures shall not be considered a part of the small wireless facility for purposes of the size restrictions of a small wireless facility.
2. This subsection shall not be construed to limit the Village's enforcement of historic preservation in conformance with the requirements adopted pursuant to the Illinois State Agency Historic Resources Preservation Act or the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, 54 U.S.C. Section 300101 *et seq.*, and the regulations adopted to implement those laws.

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### ANALYSIS

#### BACKGROUND

SB 1451 created the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act (the “Act”), and was signed into law on April 12, 2018, as Public Act 100-0585. The Act has the primary goal of allowing the telecommunications industry to roll out a 5G telecommunications network in the next several years with minimal input by local governments regarding the placement of small cell installations. In order to create an effective 5G network, the industry has indicated small cell antennas must be placed in populated areas approximately every 200-300 feet, typically on utility or other poles in the right-of-way.

The Act specifies how municipalities may regulate the collocation of small cell antenna installations (known under the Act as “small wireless facilities”). Among other things, the Act will allow small cell antenna installations to be placed on municipal utility poles (light poles, traffic signals, etc.) of a telecommunication provider’s choosing subject to compliance with certain basic standards regarding safety and aesthetics, regardless of whether the municipality agrees to such placement. Such placements are exempted under the Act from any zoning review and are deemed to be permitted uses both in all right-of-ways (regardless of zoning district) and outside of right-of-ways in areas zoned exclusively for commercial

or industrial use. Annual fees payable to municipalities for installations on municipal utility poles are capped at \$200/year. There are strict permit processing and approval timelines in the Act, and providers are able to submit multiple location requests in a single application. Other topics covered in the Act include application requirements and fees, pole attachment agreement requirements, installation of new poles by telecommunication providers, the interplay between small cell antenna installations and municipal public safety technology, height limitations, design standards, undergrounding, timelines for approval, and application fees. The Act exempts the City of Chicago, preempts home rule, and includes a 3-year sunset date. While the Act has an effective date of June 1, 2018, the substantive provisions of the Bill have an implementation date of August 1, 2018.

In order to ensure compliance with the Act, the Village Attorney developed the attached zoning amendment (Exhibit 1) to regulate small cell installations, consistent with the requirements of the Act. An additional amendment to Chapter 10 of the Municipal Code is also required (Exhibit 2), but not subject to Plan Commission review. Finally, the Village will also adopt the attached draft design guidelines to ensure that these facilities are installed in the most aesthetic manner possible (Exhibit 3). It should be noted that due to the relative lack of existing street lights and other utility poles within the public right-of-way throughout most of the Village, it is anticipated that the majority of any 5G equipment installed in the Village would be located on new utility poles erected specifically for the installation of the 5G equipment.

## DISCUSSION

Adoption of regulations regarding small wireless facilities is necessary in light of the new state law. Although the Village's authority to regulate the facilities is significantly limited by the law, a lack of local regulation could potentially result in the installation of small wireless facilities without any regulation. This could result in more haphazard and disorderly installations than could be achieved with local regulation. Additionally, the proposed design guidelines will give the Village the ability to ensure that these facilities are installed in the most orderly and least disruptive manner possible.

Due to the relative lack of existing utility poles within the Village, it is anticipated that many small wireless facility installations will either be located on existing ComEd utility poles throughout the village, or on new utility poles. The proposed draft zoning ordinance will regulate the installation of these facilities as a permitted use when located entirely within a public right-of-way in the R-1-A, R-4, B-1 and B-2 Zoning Districts; and as a permitted use anywhere within the O-1 and M-1 Zoning Districts. It should be noted that public utility easements are also considered right-of-way for the purpose of these facilities so long as the installation is comparable to existing utilities in the easement (i.e. such as above grade versus below grade).

One area the Village has some authority to regulate is in the actual pole standard used for new pole installations. Within reason, the Village can regulate the material and color of the pole, and the proposed design guidelines require "stealth" installations that will minimize the proliferation of excess wires and equipment. The proposed guidelines can also encourage installation of facilities on existing poles over installation of new poles.

Images of various types of small wireless installations are shown on the following page. New poles could be composed of either wood or metal. Staff is seeking Plan Commission input on what standards the Village should include for new pole installations. However, we do recommend that new poles installed along streets should be constructed of metal with a black powder coat or similar finish. Based on Plan Commission input, staff will revise the proposed design guidelines to reflect the recommended preference which will then be presented to the Village Council for adoption.

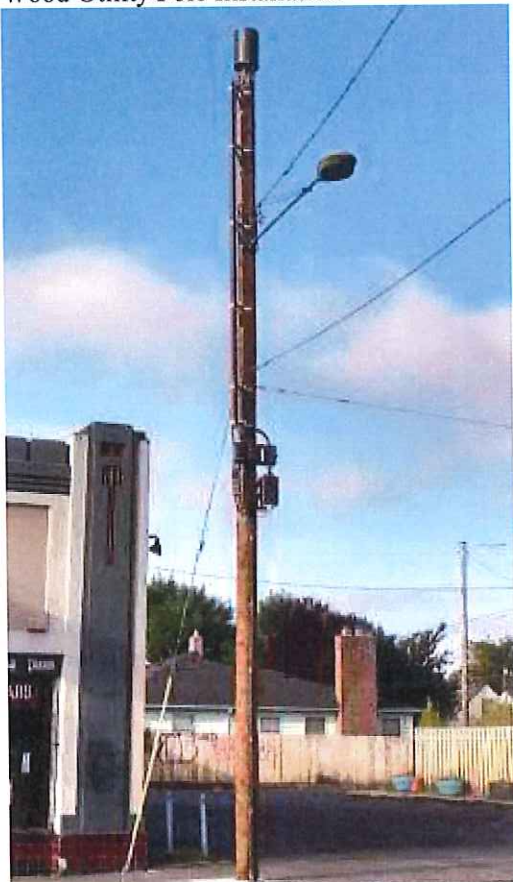

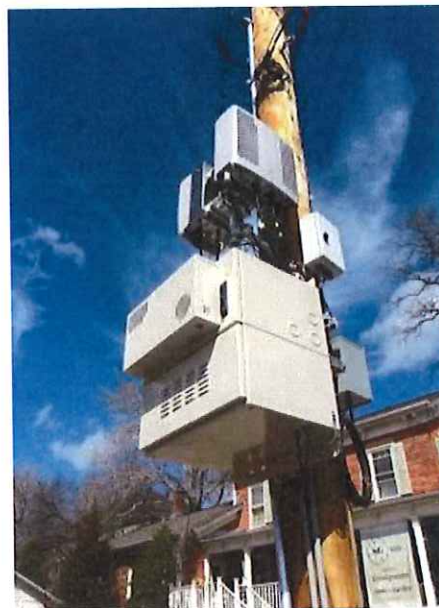

The Village of Palos Park is requesting Text Amendments which include, but may not be limited to: a Text Amendment to Chapter 1260.08 Definitions to define Small Wireless Facilities; Chapter 1278.02 to add Small Wireless Facilities as a permitted Special Use; Text Amendments to Chapters 1268.02, 1270, 1272, 1274.02, and 1274.03 to permit Small Wireless Facilities as a permitted use when located entirely within a public right-of-way in the R-1-A, R-4, R-5, B-1 and B-2 Zoning Districts; and Text Amendments to Chapter 1275.02 and 1276.02 to allow Small Wireless Facilities as a permitted use anywhere within the O-1 and M-1 Zoning Districts.

Chair O'Connor introduced the public hearing and Mallory Milluzzi represented the Village as she presented the draft zoning amendments and design guidelines in the updated staff report just handed to all Members.

Chair O'Connor asked if the Members have a choice in this matter and Ms. Milluzzi replied that is a requirement that our Village Code reflect the requirements of the Act.

Member Dill asked what the vision is for these new poles in residential areas and Ms. Milluzzi answered that new poles can be installed in the right-of-ways. She also said to reference the sample pictures in the packets in order to establish guidelines as to what the poles could look like. Lauren Pruss recommended installing new black or wooden poles and it may be possible that these small wireless facilities can be installed on existing wood poles, as neat as possible.

Ms. Milluzzi also stated that if there will be underground installation, there will be a process to apply for a waiver. In addition, the wireless companies do not need permission from the homeowner's for installation.

Chair O'Connor asked what would be the height of these poles and Ms. Milluzzi replied that they have to be installed ten feet above existing poles or a maximum of 45 feet.

Member Marcyn asked if this new equipment could be attached to existing cell towers and Lauren Pruss answered that this is a new phase of wireless technology that is a required upgrade throughout the state of Illinois.

Member Wegele asked how these facilities will be powered and envisions a lot of wires going from pole to pole throughout the Village. Ms. Milluzzi explained that there will not be any hanging wires from the poles as most installations will be connected underground, which is part of the design guidelines. Lauren Pruss commented further saying permits will be issued for this work, reviewed for accuracy, and will have to be within the Village's design guidelines.

Member Wegele suggested making it a requirement for installation to be underground and Member Dill added the Village should encourage the use of existing poles for the new installation. Ms. Milluzzi stated that poles will have to be every 200 – 300 feet to meet their needs and will be structurally sound. Member Wegele also asked about the fees for this installation and Ms. Milluzzi confirmed that page 19 of the staff report details the maximum amount the Village can charge for processing the applications and required inspections.

Ms. Milluzzi confirmed that the major cell carriers like Verizon, Sprint, T-Mobile will be the companies applying for the permits and doing the installations.

Member Dill asked if the Village could limit the amount of poles but Ms. Milluzzi said that all suppliers have different needs and there are limitations as to how close together these poles can be placed.

Member McCarthy said that he envisions seeing pole after pole down the residential streets. He then asked if there are any pilot municipalities that have these poles up. Ms. Milluzzi replied that this goes into effect on August 1, 2018 so it's too new in the area to see examples but her firm did pull information from Denver's design guidelines. She also said that this Act is being streamlined across the nation and there are 19 other states enacting this now who have stricter requirements than the Village of Palos Park.

Chair O'Connor expressed her dislike for the black pole saying that it does not enhance the area. Member McCarthy asked how much of the infrastructure will be underground and how will they be able to connect from one pole to the other. Ms. Milluzzi stated that each carrier has different standards but any wiring will not be clustered together; they will be connected underground with fibers. Ms. Milluzzi reminded all that the waiver provision can be utilized to specify underground utilities. Lauren Pruss commented that there is no ordinance regarding underground utilities.

Member McCarthy asked if it's possible to put everything underground and Lauren Pruss answered the equipment has to be in one box and has to be far enough up in the air to be effective.

Ms. Milluzzi clarified that there will not be four or five poles clustered together in one area. She confirmed that there will only be one pole every 200 - 300 feet. Member McCarthy added that it may be possible to have a pole every 600 feet instead of 200 feet, due to better band width of the small wireless facilities. Ms. Milluzzi said that could be a possibility.

Member Dill suggested that the location of these poles could be limited in certain areas. Lauren Pruss stated that these small wireless facilities provide more user access, faster speeds for less money, and use less power than cell towers.

Ms. Milluzzi commented that these devices will only get small and probably will not be necessarily located every 200 feet but there is the need to get this 5G speed to your homes. She said the Villages thought process going forward will be for the design guidelines and what standard look is desired in Palos Park.

Chair O'Connor asked about using the current wood poles. Lauren Pruss said that the wooden poles blend in with the trees and they are located throughout the Village. However, the metal poles will have the wiring on the inside and stealth installation.

Member Dill suggested using the new black poles in the commercial areas along LaGrange and McCarthy Roads. Member Wegele suggested using whatever poles are currently being used on the roads. Chair O'Connor agreed and recommended keeping the poles consistent with what is currently in the area.

Member Dill proposed using clean, monolithic, shrouding of the wires for the existing poles so as to blend in. Member McCarthy stated that geographic location is key and the design guidelines could be better if we knew where the poles were going to be installed.

Lauren Pruss stated that the law requires the Village to become compliant and allows us to regulate these poles as strict as possible. If we do not adopt, we lose our ability to have design standards. The Members suggested using existing poles when possible, new wood poles in residential areas, and the black metal poles to be installed on LaGrange, in commercial areas, and non-residential areas.

Chair O'Connor said that the new black poles will be more effective with future commercial development and confirmed they need a permit before any work can begin.

Ms. Milluzzi confirmed the cell companies will be reaching out to the municipalities for permits. She said that it is better to work with these cell companies that want to work with municipalities rather than complain about the process.

Chair O'Connor asked for a motion. Motion was made by Ed Marcyn, second by Matt Dill to approve the proposed amendments to Chapter 1260.08 Definitions to define Small Wireless Facilities; Chapter 1278.02 to add Small Wireless Facilities as a permitted Special Use; Chapters 1268.02, 1270, 1272, 1274.02, and 1274.03 to permit Small Wireless Facilities as a permitted use when located entirely within a public right-of-way; and Chapter 1275.02 and 1276.02 to allow Small Wireless Facilities as a permitted use anywhere within the O-1 and M-1 Zoning Districts.

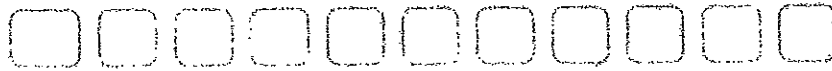

The low bidder was Lindahl Brothers of Chicago Ridge (Formerly Crowley-Shepard). Their bid of \$ 544,935.00 was under the Engineers Estimate of \$ 672,487.50. IDOT will not allow any bid item to run more than 10% over the contract quantities. As such, Public Works is asking approval to award the MFT Contract to Lindahl Brothers in the amount of \$ 544,935.00 and to give the Village Engineer approval to increase the quantities to the maximum allowed by IDOT with a contract amount not to exceed \$600,000.00.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the 2019 MFT Paving Program be awarded to Lindahl Brothers of Chicago Ridge.

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:**

I move to award the 2019 MFT Project to Lindahl brothers in the amount of \$ 544,935.00, and to give the Village Engineer the authority to increase the project quantities to the maximum IDOT will allow with a contract amount not to exceed \$ 600,000.00.

**Palos Park Police take part in national " Stop the Bleed" program  
Time is crucial when dealing with seriously bleeding wounds**

**Trauma experts say the goal is to make this training as common as CPR**

**Palos Park police officers will undergo training in August to take part in a national effort to prepare officers to respond to traumatic events involving massive bleeding. The "Stop the Bleed" program allows an officer to take action quickly on a scene and could mean life or death for someone bleeding excessively.**

**The "Stop the Bleed" program teaches officers to apply tourniquets, pack wounds and apply pressure to still the flow of blood after a mass casualty incident, a traffic crash, a workplace accident, a shooting or a stabbing.**

**Someone with uncontrolled bleeding can die within minutes, and EMS can take minutes to arrive on the scene. That's where training police officers in "Stop the Bleed" focuses on identifying where the bleeding is coming from and how to work to control bleeding.**

**Palos Park Police Commissioner Dan Polk, a retired Neonatologist said. " Taking action after an event in which someone is injured, whether it is a terrorist attack or a vehicle accident, could mean the difference between life and death. Our patrol staff learning how to prevent a manageable wound from turning into a life-threatening one is critical for those officers out on patrol in our community 24 / 7 / 365."**

**Since police officers are often among the first to arrive at the scene of an injury, it makes sense for officers to be equipped and ready to administer blood control measures that could save a person's life.**
